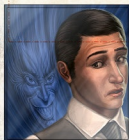


NAME: *Annie*

## A HOME EXPERIMENT THAT'S A SCREAM

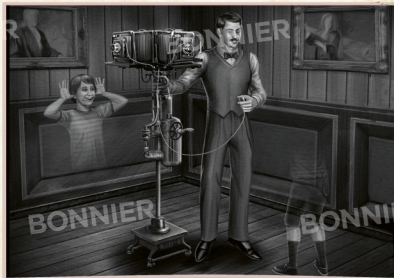
*To make a ghost visible in a mirror, stare into your own eyes in a dark room until you feel it grow cooler. Make the ghost appear by repeating:*

## TRICKING THE TRICKY

Not all ghosts can be trusted to offer help. Tricksters, such as my dead friends 'Dicky' and 'Micky' (who also haunt my Tarrytown home) love to play tricks on inexperienced ghostologists: Micky's bottom half appears in front, while Dicky's top half appears behind and shouts "Boo!" Only by using a G.H.O.S.T.S. Phantom 360 to record every part of the room at once can you show that there are two trickster ghosts at work.

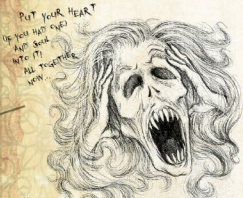

# TYPES OF GHOST

## POLTERGEISTS & TRICKSTERS

Although each haunting is different, ghosts can be separated into broadly similar types for the purposes of study. It is essential to learn these, for some ghosts need to be treated with greater care than others. In the case of spirits such as noisy ghosts, for example, detectable by eerie howls, sorrowful moans or ghostly 'woo-woing', their bark is worse than their non-existent bite. With poltergeists the opposite is true: these ghosts cause physical disturbances, throwing or levitating objects, knocking at doors, even pinching, hitting or using their teeth. With diligent study you will soon learn what to expect from each kind of ghost and, more importantly, when to duck!



### WOOOCCCCCCCCCCCCC NOISY GHOSTS

The best way to deal with noisy ghosts is to pretend that you cannot hear them, as it undermines their confidence. If they redouble their efforts, a pair of thick earmuffs will help keep you comfortable as you record their activities on a gramophone.

**LOCATION**—Large old houses with creaky floorboards, castles with noisome dungeons, cavernous places with plenty of opportunity for chilling echoes.  
**WHEN THEY HAUNT**—Almost exclusively between midnight and four in the morning.  
**APPEARANCE**—They are happy to be seen, and may take on a 'scary' disguise of a yellow face or pointed teeth.

*While it cannot be denied that poltergeists like my friend Yuan Gui are, at times, given to the most outrageous outbursts, once a proper rapport has been built up, a true tone can work wonders. Poltergeists are invisible, though I have observed that, when particularly active, Yuan Gui appears in mirrors.*

### COMMON POLTERGEIST

Attention-seekers *par excellence*, poltergeists are ghosts who have a grudge, which, being dead, they can do little about. They therefore resort to childish displays of irritation and it is only by determining exactly what it is that they want—and by speaking to them in a friendly but firm tone—that they can be brought around.

**LOCATION**—Almost everywhere; particularly attracted to homes with delicate ornaments or priceless Ming-dynasty vases, which they love to smash.  
**WHEN THEY HAUNT**—As likely to haunt in the day as at night.  
**APPEARANCE**—Invisible; they use other means of attracting attention.

## HISTORICAL GHOSTS

There are innumerable cases of historical ghosts, including presidents such as Abraham Lincoln, queens such as Anne Boleyn and even famous criminals such as the English highwayman Dick Turpin. They are best left alone, for their fame makes them difficult to deal with.

**LOCATION**—Castles, stately homes and inns.

**WHEN THEY HAUNT**—Often on the anniversary of their death at the stroke of midnight.

**APPEARANCE**—Dressed in armour or fine apparel, sometimes in a carriage drawn by headless horses.

## THE DREADED COLD SPOT

It is a curious fact that ghosts who are ignored grow dimmer over time, until they look like a white sheet with two black eyes and a large mouth. Sounds are reduced to an indistinct moaning. Eventually all visual traces of them fade until all that is left is a 'cold spot' that cannot be warmed even by the most modern electric bar fire or radiator.

**LOCATION**—Almost anywhere indoors, especially common in graveyards and ruined castles.

**WHEN THEY HAUNT**—It is easier to feel cold spots in the summer as they 'feed' its 'hunger' in' during the winter months.

**APPEARANCE**—None. A cold spot is a sign of a spectre that has 'given up' the ghost'.

## THE SEVEN SOUNDS THAT HERALD A HAUNTING

- i. Screams—usually an attempt to frighten people away
- ii. Footsteps—used to lead listeners to a particular place, which may be worth further investigation
- iii. Whistling and crying—either at the cruel melancholy of Fate, or in frustration because you don't look scared
- iv. Rattling chains—unless you are near an old dungeon or work for someone named Ebenezer, it's likely there are tricksters in the area
- v. Whispering—the sign of a shy ghost, which must be coaxed to fully appear
- vi. Knocking at the window—the ghost wants to come in
- vii. Moans—when none of the other sounds have worked



## TRICKSTERS

Tricksters are the most common ghost type encountered by the inexperienced ghostologist. Announcing that you are determined to undertake a scientific study of ghosts seems to cue a sudden rush of apparent hauntings that usually turn out to be just one or two tricksters. Not hard to outwit, tricksters can become a ghostologist's firm allies once they are convinced of your seriousness to understand them.

**LOCATION**—Seances, newspaper offices.  
**WHEN THEY HAUNT**—Whenever they can find opportunities for amusement at the expense of the credulous.

**APPEARANCE**—Dependent on what mischief they wish to get up to.



## ANNE BOLEYN'S GHOST

Anne Boleyn, the young queen who was beheaded at the Tower of London in 1536 on the orders of her husband, Henry VIII, is a famous historical ghost. She haunts the Tower, where she screams, slams doors and leaves unsightly bloodstains on the floor on the anniversary of her death. Sometimes her ghost visits the castle of her rival, Jane Seymour, who married the king the day after Anne's death. The two 'White Ladies' have been seen on the lawn having, one assumes, a humdrum of a row.

# TYPES OF GHOST

## HARBINGERS & HELPERS

Once you have attended a few hauntings of the more common ghosts, it is time to expand your horizons by studying spirits that meddle in the affairs of the living. Helpers do their best to assist humans, pointing the way out of trouble, firing ghostly arrows on the battlefield and revealing the location of lost treasures. Harbingers, on the other hand, issue dreadful warnings of impending doom — the worse the news they must impart, the greater their ghoulish pleasure in imparting it.

### HARBINGERS

The instant you hear the heart-stopping howl of the harbinger or find yourself quaking before a banshee's baleful scowl, you must put all trembling aside and pay attention. Maybe, with a harbinger's fierce forewarning, peril can be avoided. Perhaps, with a banshee's blessing, one who was on a doom-laden path may find that they still have time to turn back.

**LOCATION**—Dark forests and fields, cemeteries at night, lonely roads.

**WHEN THEY HAUNT**—Prior to some disaster; forecasting the coming year; at Halloween.

**APPEARANCE**—Almost invariably frightening.



The Dullahan—a headless harbinger from Ireland—presages the certain doom of all who see him, unless he is generously rewarded off with gold. You should therefore carry a small token of this metal.

Polar explorer Shackleton, undertaking a desperate Antarctic voyage to find help, was assisted by a 'helpier'. During that long and tiring march of thirty-six hours over the unnamed mountains and glaciers of South Georgia, he wrote, 'it seemed to me often that we were four, not three.'



DO GOODERY - NOT RECOMMENDED!

### HELPERS

Helpers appear in difficult or dangerous situations and, unlike harbingers, do their best to assist. However, unless they are also poltergeists they find it difficult to actually do much — unless it is to give directions. But their aid can raise morale.

**LOCATION**—Battlefields; remote wild areas; towns, though here they must show greater discretion. **WHEN THEY HAUNT**—Whenever they are needed. Their motto, 'Be Prepared,' has since been adopted by the Scouting Movement. **APPEARANCE**—Like tricksters, to whom they are undoubtedly related, they change their appearance to suit the situation.



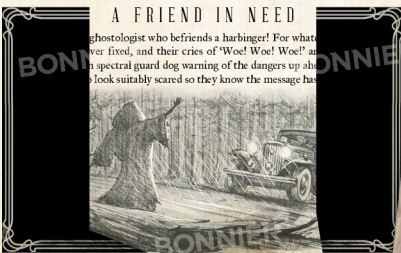
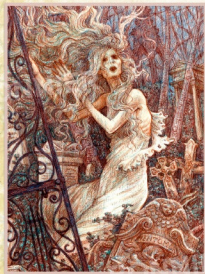

### THE BATTLE OF MONS

Exciting news reports told how helper ghosts assisted troops at the Battle of Mons during the Great War. Unfortunately, there was no ghostologist present, so we must take the story as hearsay, rather than fact. Some believe the story to be a fake, others are convinced they can remember seeing them.

## OBAMBO



The African obambo is a sad ghost who has died far from home. It wishes to rest in peace near its family, and settles down once a model house is built and a ceremony is performed to welcome it back.

**LOCATION** — The outskirts of its town or village.

**WHEN THEY HAUNT** — A short time after its death.

**APPEARANCE** — Often frightening, it pieces together a body made of leaves and twigs. Harmless in nature.

## DYBBUK



If you hear two voices in your head, one might be a dybbuk. These ghosts love to 'possess' humans. They are known to hide in boxes, waiting for the right moment to come out. If you receive a strange package in the post: BEWARE!

**LOCATION** — Anywhere, typically jars, lamps and boxes.

**WHEN THEY HAUNT** — Whenever the box or jar is opened.

**APPEARANCE** — Usually invisible; hideous otherwise.

## KODAMA



If you encounter a strange 'ghost light' while walking in a Japanese forest, you may have met a kodama. These spirits take up residence in trees and will offer assistance in return for offerings.

**LOCATION** — Ancient Japanese forests.

**WHEN THEY HAUNT** — In spring and autumn.

**APPEARANCE** — Glowing orbs of light that linger on or around trees. May take the form of a human to communicate with the living.

# CHAPTER 5 TYPES OF GHOST A MISCELLANY

It should never be forgotten that ghosts are a worldwide phenomenon as old as humanity itself. Every culture tells ghost stories and has its own special way of remembering the dead. In America, one may not even have to travel far to seek out the ghosts of other cultures as immigrants have always brought their ghosts with them. The Irish dullahean and Jewish dybbuk are just two examples. But wherever you live, there will always be plenty to study.

## THE DAY OF THE DEAD

In Mexico, November 2 marks the Day of the Dead, on which ancestral spirits are shown a proper respect. Families construct an *ofrenda* with offerings of favourite food items to commemorate a deceased relation, encouraging their ghost to visit.

If it could come as no surprise that not all ghosts are the spirits of humans. Animals often return from the Other Side. Those best-known include the ghost bear of the Colosseum in Rome, the phantom rabbit of Thetford and the vicious shape-shifting kelpie, or 'water horse', of Scotland.

# HAUNTED HOUSES, HOTELS AND FORTS

Now that we have studied some of the more common types of ghost, the question arises of where we should go to begin our work. Fortunately, there is such a profusion of haunted places around the world that there is almost certain to be one not far away, wherever you may live. Starting with places near at hand, a ghost-hunter's field kit, complete with sketchbook and recording equipment, can be put to use immediately.

## A ROOM WITH A BOOOOO!

Sometimes ghosts choose to haunt a particular room. Such is the case with room 217 at the Stanley Hotel in Colorado, where the housekeeper, Ms Elizabeth Wilson, was electrocuted during a lightning storm. Visitors who have slept in the room since are subject to all manner of entertaining phenomena.

## TOWER OF LONDON

No ghostological visit to England's capital is complete without seeing the ghosts at the Tower of London: Anne Boleyn, the sad queen who Henry VIII beheaded; the Countess of Salisbury, whose screams made even my blood run cold; and the Princes in the Tower, two boys allegedly murdered on the orders of their uncle Richard III.



The ghost of poor queen Anne Boleyn is often heard to say that if it were as easy to join her head and body as it were to separate them in the first place, she would give up haunting for good.

## THE WHITE HOUSE

The president's house is well-known for its hauntings. Ghosts include previous presidents such as Abraham Lincoln (16<sup>th</sup>), who appears when the country is in danger; Thomas Jefferson (5<sup>th</sup>), whose skill with the violin has not much changed with death; and Andrew Jackson (7<sup>th</sup>), whose loud 'cussing' can sometimes cause offense.



Some claim William Munsell's photograph of the ghost of Abraham Lincoln is a fake. The ghost claims that he used in that stiff fashion in order to find rest that sort of person. Also, naturally, long enough for this first-hand sketch to be made.

## BORLEY RECTORY

If you are in England, a good place to start a ghostological investigation is at Borley Rectory, its most haunted house. Here the ghosts are so numerous it can be difficult telling one from another. To help with record-keeping, always obtain plans of the house—both as it is now and as it was in the past. If the layout has changed, a ghost may seem to walk through a wall that has been added, or disappear into a room that has, for some reason, been sealed shut.



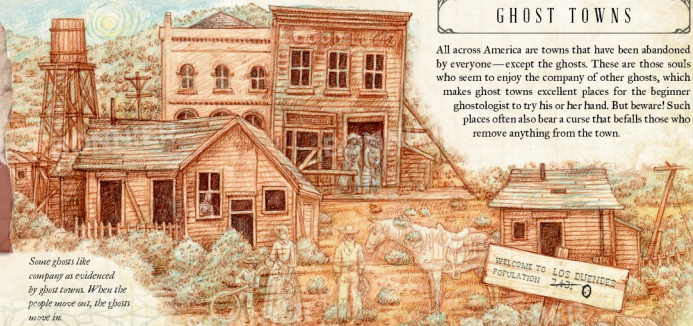

## GHOST TOWNS

These are those souls who seek to enjoy the company of other ghosts, which makes ghost towns excellent places for the beginner ghostologist to try his or her hand. But beware! Such places often also bear a curse that befalls those who remove anything from the town.

# HAUNTED SHIPS AND TREASURES

*GHOST TIP: IF HAUNTING A BOOK, MAKE SURE THAT THE HAUNTED PAGES ARE NEBLED UP DIFFERENTLY EVERY TIME THEY ARE OPENED.*

As you gain experience, you will realise that you can sometimes have your ghostology 'to go'. Ghosts attach themselves to moveable objects of all sizes, from the largest (ghost) ships down to small items such as jewels or books. Indeed, nearly all historical treasures—such as the gem embedded on the cover of this book—are haunted. In the case of haunted books, if a ghost becomes trapped between two pages, it can wreak all kinds of havoc with words and images. G.H.O.S.T.S. suggests that you seal them well shut.

## FLYING DUTCHMAN

The storm-tossed ghost ship the *Flying Dutchman* appears when tempests blow. It seems that the ghosts aboard do not know they are dead, for they often hail other ships, trying to send packages and letters to long-dead relatives. Unless a ghostologist can one day make them understand their condition, they will be cursed to circumnavigate the earth forever.

## GHOST PIRATES

Maybe it is because buccaners still seek to protect their ill-gotten treasure that they linger on as ghosts after their—often gruesome and untimely—deaths. Captain Henry Morgan (1600s) in particular appears to spiritualists, who claim to be impressed by his bearded face and masterful voice.



*For any ghostologist, a trip on the Flying Dutchman will provide a bracing, if blustery, ride. It is recommended first learning to swim.*

## MARY CELESTE

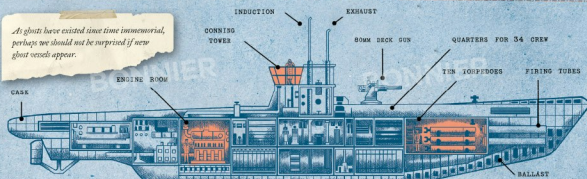
The *Mary Celeste* was captured by the ghosts of Barbary pirates. Go aboard and it will seem as though the crew left a moment ago, with food on the table and a fire in the galley. Yet tow her into port and you will find her gone by the morning, as the pirate ghosts set off to hunt for loot.



## HAUNTED BOOK

An old book may often be haunted either by a spirit within the pages or, in the case of the present volume, because the author has attached an object—such as a gem—to it. As ghosts find it little trouble to be in more than one place at a time, Hamid has agreed to haunt each and every copy of *Ghostology*, in order to help ghostologists with their studies. Treat him with respect!

## HIDDEN TREASURE

Rare and ancient gemstones in particular are often haunted, and a ghost detector, divining rods or spending a night alone with one in a dark room will soon confirm this fact. It is often the case that when these jewels change hands, those who owned them in life pursue them after death, seeking to scare away the new owners.



*The Black Prince's Ruby, which is set in the imperial state crown of England, is haunted by the ghost of a sultan who was treacherously slain. The gem is believed to have brought misfortune to many.*



*The Koh-i-Noor diamond has been set in the crown of many British queens. It is thought to bring bad luck to any man who wears it.*



*A ghost named Hamid is trapped inside the Templar Ruby. To escape, he must convince you to utter a charm. Do not do so!*

# A GHOSTOLOGIST'S FIELD KIT

While the experienced ghostologist will collect and enjoy a vast array of scientific ghost-hunting paraphernalia in order to assist them in paranormal pursuits, when you are just starting out you need no more than a few basic items. Packed into a large trunk or valise, they should be accessible in less time than it takes to say 'Boo!' Most are easy to obtain, while others may be acquired at any reputable local purveyor of ghost-hunting gadgets or via G.H.O.S.T.S.



SKETCHBOOK

Ghosts sometimes play tricks, but our memories play them all the time. A sketchbook is an essential piece of equipment. Notes and sketches must be made as soon after one's hands have stopped shaking as possible.



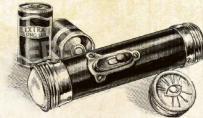
ACCURATE TIMEPIECE

A regular pocket watch may suffice for a few forays, but certain ghosts love to tamper with time, sending the hands forwards, backwards or making them whirl around and around. A tamper-proof timepiece should be obtained from a reliable supplier.



SLIPPERS

In ghost-hunting, silence is golden! A pair of felt overshoes are a must to 'deaden' footsteps and can even result in the successful user getting the 'jump' on unsuspecting ghosts.



FLASHLIGHT

Even beginner ghostologists soon come to realise that it is all too easy for ghosts to blow out candles with a simple puff of air. With a modern battery-powered flashlight, even the darkest corners and gloomiest rooms will offer no place for unhelpful hunters to hide.



GHOST DETECTOR

Modern ghostologists use a device with a powerful electric current to detect electrical or magnetic changes. Never use one for bath-beds hauntings, however, unless you wish to become a ghost yourself.

CAMERAS

Most ghosts are remarkably camera shy, while others behave as though they would like to have been actors in life. It is recommended to have two types of camera, one loaded with normal film, the other with infrared to capture heat anomalies.

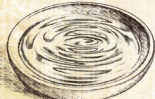


GHOST POWDER

A new and exciting innovation, these powders can be cast across a room in a mist to reveal the movements of invisible ghosts or dusted discreetly across the floor to show the telltale footprints of hoax hunters. They should on no account be breathed in.

BOWL OF WATER

In extremely scary situations it can be difficult to determine if perceived movement is caused by one's own fearful quaking or by actual ghostly tremors. The ripples in water help one to estimate their size and duration.

Mirror (to check if the ghost has a reflection)

Recording equipment

Thermometer (to measure sudden drops in temperature)

Cricket bat (a weapon for battling ghosts at bay)

DIVINING RODS

A pair of crossed wires or even chopsticks will begin to tremble in the presence of ghosts, and lead seekers to the source of a haunting so that, we may say: "Pull up the floorboards here, and let us see what lies beneath!"

## A CASE TO STUDY

For your first foray, it is recommended to accompany an experienced ghostologist on an investigation. Where this is not possible, reading the case studies of ghostologists can prove most edifying. I have included a case of my own, taken from my house in Tarrytown. Careful perusal of the picture will reveal the presence of numerous ghosts—some of whom wish to hide, while others clearly mean to haunt—including my poltergeist friend Yuan Gui, a very noisy previous owner.

## ◦ FIG. 1: PHOTOGRAPHS

It is always a good idea to diligently check pictures, photographs or daguerotypes of deceased relatives. If they vanish from the photo, it may be a warning sign that they are haunting nearby.

## ◦ FIG. 2: MIRRORS

Ghosts that are not visible to the naked eye, but whose presence can be felt, may sometimes be seen reflected in a mirror. Banshees particularly may try to shatter the glass with piercing screams to prevent this.

## ◦ FIG. 3: WINDOWS

Tapping at the window is common among ghosts that have a strong attachment to a house or building. Perhaps they were in love with the person inside and wish that they could return once again.

## ◦ FIG. 4: FURNITURE

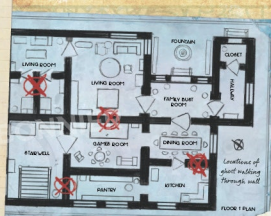
Ghost animals often hide on or inside furniture and would prefer not to be seen. Ghost cats, in particular, show great jealousy towards any living cats in a house, and do their best to scare them away.

# HOW TO HUNT GHOSTS

While your first experience of ghostly murmurs, clanking chains or spectres appearing in the bathtub may cause your heart to race, subsequent encounters will teach you that most ghosts do little harm. With your detecting kit in one hand and this book in the other, it is time to test your learning by proceeding to places where hauntings are known to happen. Sometimes we are welcome, and sometimes the restless citizens of the spirit world wish nothing more than to scare us out of our wits. But remember, it is never a good idea to forget your Ps and Qs just because you are dealing with the dead.

## STEPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL INVESTIGATION

- Set up a perimeter using tape
- Assemble cameras and recording equipment
- Place slippers on feet
- Arrange other ghost-hunting equipment
- Check temperature of room in different places
- Wait until midnight
- TAKE DEEP BREATHS!



Ghosts may appear to walk through walls if the layout of the building was different when they were alive. A perusal of the plan may be helpful.

## ON MEETING GHOSTS

It is not good manners to scream hysterically or shout when first meeting a ghost, no matter how grilly their appearance may be. It is better to act with calm insouciance, as though meeting poltergeists, tricksters or headless horsemen is perfectly routine and their horrible antics of very little importance.

## G.H.O.S.T.S. FIELD NOTES #6

### ASK YOURSELF...

As the haunting progresses, the ghostologist should bear questions such as the following in mind:

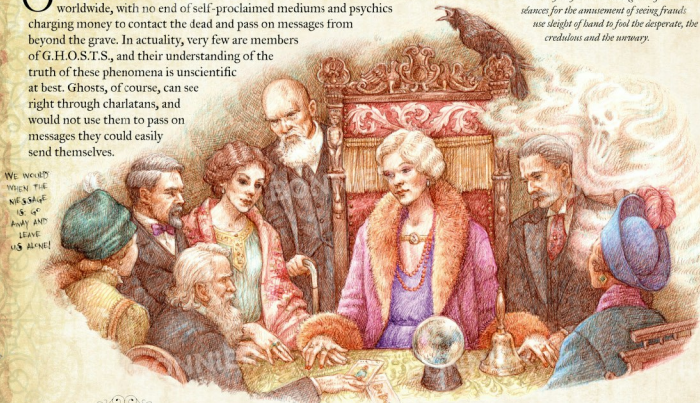
- ☛ Is that tapping at the window a tree branch or playful child? Are the moans or screams produced by non-natural means?
- ☛ Does the ghost always take the same route? Does it pass through walls? Are there any footprints?
- ☛ Does the ghost have a reflection? Does it only appear in the mirror? Do things change when nighttime falls?
- ☛ Do pictures that looked pleasant in the day take on a sinister appearance at night?
- ☛ How many ghosts are there? Can you discover any corroborative reason why there might be ghosts? For example, were there any sinister events?

# PSYCHIC'S AND MEDIUMS

Over the last 70 years spiritualism has been quite the rage in salons worldwide, with no end of self-proclaimed mediums and psychics charging money to contact the dead and pass on messages from beyond the grave. In actuality, very few are members of G.H.O.S.T.S., and their understanding of the truth of these phenomena is unscientific at best. Ghosts, of course, can see right through charlatans, and would not use them to pass on messages they could easily send themselves.

## NEVERMORE?

Not all ghosts like to converse with ghostologists, but others quite enjoy it. Edgar Allan Poe, author of such gems as *The Tell-Tale Heart* and *The Raven*, still haunts the staircase of his home on West 3rd Street, New York, and declares himself amazed — now that he is dead — at how many mediums are deluding themselves and others. He admits to taking a ghoulish delight in ruining séances by appearing in the form of a large black bird and squawking 'Nevermore!' over and over again. I saw this 'performance' with my own eyes at the séance I undertook at his home on Halloween 1922.

## OUIJA

While automatic writing — in which a medium is 'possessed' by a ghost and allows his or her hand to be used to write texts, and which has existed since at least the Song Dynasty in China — may deserve further research, the Ouija board (invented in 1890) is next to useless. Most spirits would never go near such a thing! Apart from tricksters who will have merry fun pretending to be your dead Aunt Mary or dear Uncle Fred.



The word Ouija comes from the combination of the French and German words for 'Yes'. While the author of the novel *Jay Heron* (1917) attests that it was dictated by the spirit of Mark Twain via an Ouija board, Mr Twain's ghost solemnly denied any such claims by turning a very dark shade of red.

## GHOST COLOURS

Most people believe that ghosts come in shades of white or grey. Experienced ghostologists know better. Certain ghosts have a vivid aura and exhibit the sort of rapid colour changes that would put even a chameleon or an octopus to shame, most often when they wish to attract attention.

## DANIEL DUNGLAS-HOME

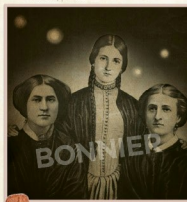
Daniel Douglas-Home (1832–1886) worked in America and Europe and was called the greatest ghostologist of all time. His cradle was said to have been rocked by unseen hands. In séances he could both levitate and float outside of windows, and get ghosts to talk, rap on the walls, play the accordion or steal handkerchiefs, which confounded even the most experienced scientific observers.

## THE FOX SISTERS

Instrumental in the creation of the Spiritualism movement (1848–present), Leah, Maggie and Kate Fox enjoyed great success as mediums with whom ghosts communicated with through 'rapping'. That was until Maggie became frightened that what they were doing was diabolical and signed a 'confession' in which she makes the claim — which she later recanted — that everything had been faked.

The suffrage movement has been closely linked with spiritualism. Perhaps we should proceed to vote if we can't get a say in government! After all, they have all the experience without any of the expectation. # CHAPTER II FAKES AND FRAUDS


There is a lot of money to be made from people mourning a loved one, scientists eager to make discoveries and those wishing to learn the secrets of the dead (where Henry Morgan hid his treasure or Aunt May dumped her diamonds). So it is no surprise there are many ghostologist fakes and frauds. It is every good ghostologist's job to unmask these, and, above all, to expose books that purport to be old tomes by a *bona fide* ghostologist, but which are little more than an imaginative pack of lies.

## FAKING PHOTOS

Although it is said that the camera never lies, photographs themselves can be manipulated, as can be seen below. Throwing an object into shot easily adds a 'ghost' to an otherwise unspooky scene.

## SPOTTING A FAKER

This innocent-looking stance, in front of an audience of credulous attendees, in fact contains numerous examples of fakery and miscellaneous sleight of hand. Such trickery is greatly assisted by near total darkness. Let the *ghostologia* take note!



GHOST TIP: FAKES ARE OUR FRIENDS WHEN IT COMES TO FEELING THE LIVING HELP THEM WHEREVER POSSIBLE (UNLESS OF COURSE WE KNOW THEY WENT EXACTLY AS FAKED ANYMORE).

### TELL-TALE SIGNS OF FAKERY

A. An assistant in the next room utters the words that purport to be spoken by a ghost or manipulates model(s) of ghosts in the dark.

B. The touch of a dead loved one's hand upon a cheek, shoulder or knee is produced by a fake hand attached at the end of a long pole.

C. Many mediums are centriloquists who can drink a glass of water while whistling, or pretending, to be dear departed Uncle John.

D. Ghostly noises may be produced by simply kicking the table, as it is much harder to tell where noise are coming from in the dark.

E. Ladies' long skirts and petticoats provide the perfect hiding place for coconut 'shell', sticks or other means of producing ghostly rattling.

F. A well-placed knee under a table can cause it to leap about as if possessed, no matter how many people are trying to hold it down.

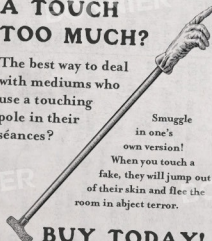

A bell housed in a box in front of the medium.

The great stage magician Harry Houdini has recently made it his business to play unscrupulous mediums at their own game. He proposes challenging supposed psychics to sit in a special cabinet he has designed, in which they are allowed to summon spirits. Of course, no true ghostologist needs to take up the challenge—we know our powers are real.

## OLD NEWS

Fraudulent French spiritualist Eva Carrière (b. 1886) used to produce ectoplasm—a supernatural substance in which spirits would appear in visible form—during her séances. When the Society for Psychical Research investigated her in 1920 they discovered the 'ectoplasm' was really made up of photographs torn out of *Le Miroir* magazine and then chern.

True ectoplasm forms out of the midnight air like a grey cloud that—in a flash—takes the shape of a weeping child, beardless knight or howling hussar, and van from a puff from *Le Miroir* (left)



## ROYALLY DECEIVED

The gullibility of non-professional ghostologists can be shown in the way 'Eva C.' used cardboard cutouts of dead celebrities. In the darkened room, it seemed that the ghost of old King Ferdinand of Bulgaria had come to ask the audience to donate money to Eva for her psychic experiments. Even after taking a flashlit photograph, one psychic researcher declared that she was unsure if the image was really a fake or not.



# A HISTORY OF GHOSTS AND GHOST-HUNTERS

Interest in ghosts may be timeless, since they are as old as humankind, but those who are not aware of the mistakes of past ghostologists are condemned to repeat them. The truly serious student of ghostology should therefore read all available historical accounts of ghosts, starting with ancient Rome and ancient Greece. Studied in the light of modern, scientific ghostological knowledge, these tales will amplify and deepen your knowledge of ghosts and their ways, and help you to ghouly in your work. After all, when there are no hauntings to be had, there's nothing better than curling up with a good book about one's favourite subject: ghosts.



THE DRUMMER  
OF TEDWORTH

In 1663 the English researcher Joseph Glanvill recorded numerous poltergeists drumming and thumping in the house of a magistrate who had confiscated a drum. The poltergeists would tear off bed sheets at night and throw shoes at the terrified residents.

PLINY'S GHOST

The Roman author Pliny the Younger wrote of a philosopher, Athenodorus, who rented a house in Athens very cheaply. The reason for the price became clear when he was haunted one night by the ghost of an old man bound in chains. The ghost beckoned the philosopher and led him to a spot in the courtyard. Digging there, Athenodorus discovered the skeleton of an old man, bound in chains.

History is full of tales of ghosts and poltergeists, showing us that ghostology must be one of the oldest professions in the world.

## THE VERSAILLES TIMESLIP

In 1901, two teachers from St. Hugh's College, England, were visiting the Palace of Versailles in France. They got lost in the gardens and found themselves in the company of a group of people from 1789, including the French queen Marie Antoinette. Believing that they had travelled back in time, they made their way out of the garden and back to 1901.

Timeslips cannot really occur. The ladies were simply haunted by a group of ghosts from the time of the French Revolution.

## FAMOUS GHOST-HUNTERS

### HARRY PRICE

A modern psychic investigator making a name for himself, Harry Price (b. 1884) is determined to be the greatest ghost-hunter history has ever known. He aims to unmask charlatans, but often writes off cases of haunting where, unknown to him, real ghosts were involved.

Harry Price has perhaps the most modern collection of ghost-hunting equipment ever assembled by one man.

### WILLIAM MUMLER

After noticing that the image of a young cousin who had died some 12 years earlier had appeared on a self-portrait he was developing, William Mumler soon found that his supposed ability to capture photos of the deceased haunted him an eager clientele.



In Mumler's photos the ghosts often struck rigid poses, so that Mumler could claim, if necessary, that it was all a hoax caused by double exposure.

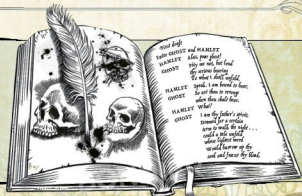
