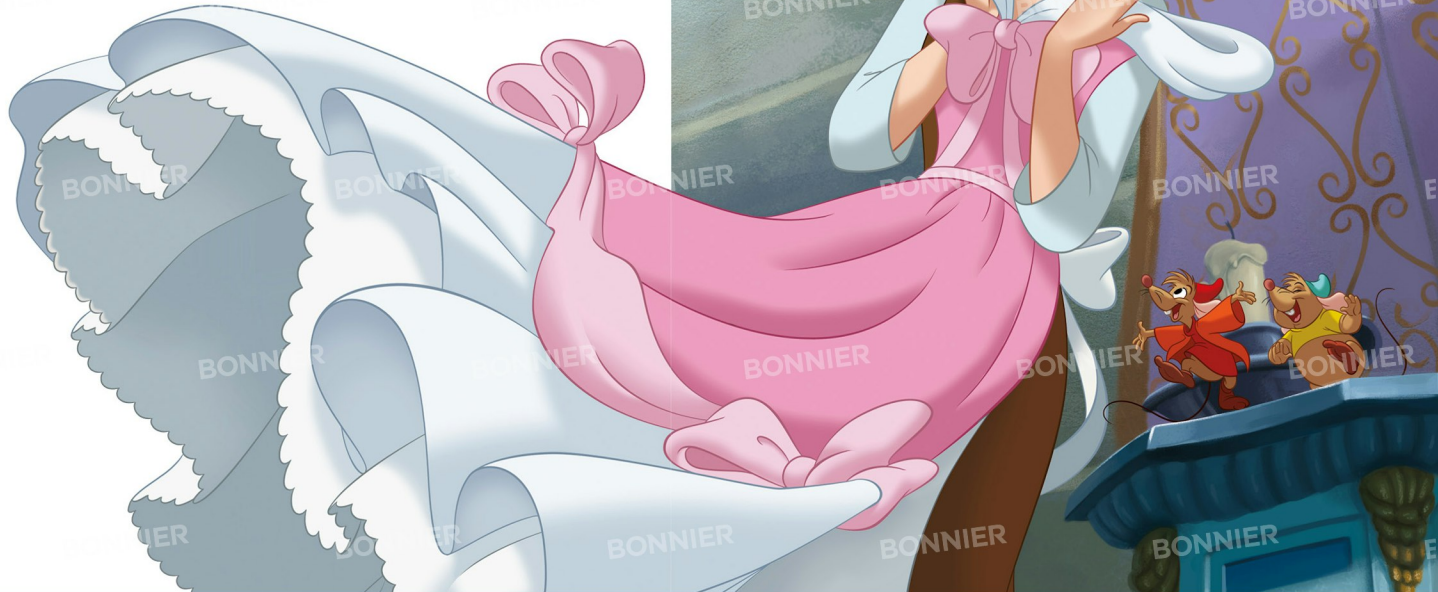
The invitations were delivered that very day.

When at last her chores were done, Cinderella discovered a wonderful surprise. Her animal friends had been sewing all day. Her mother's dress was now a beautiful gown!

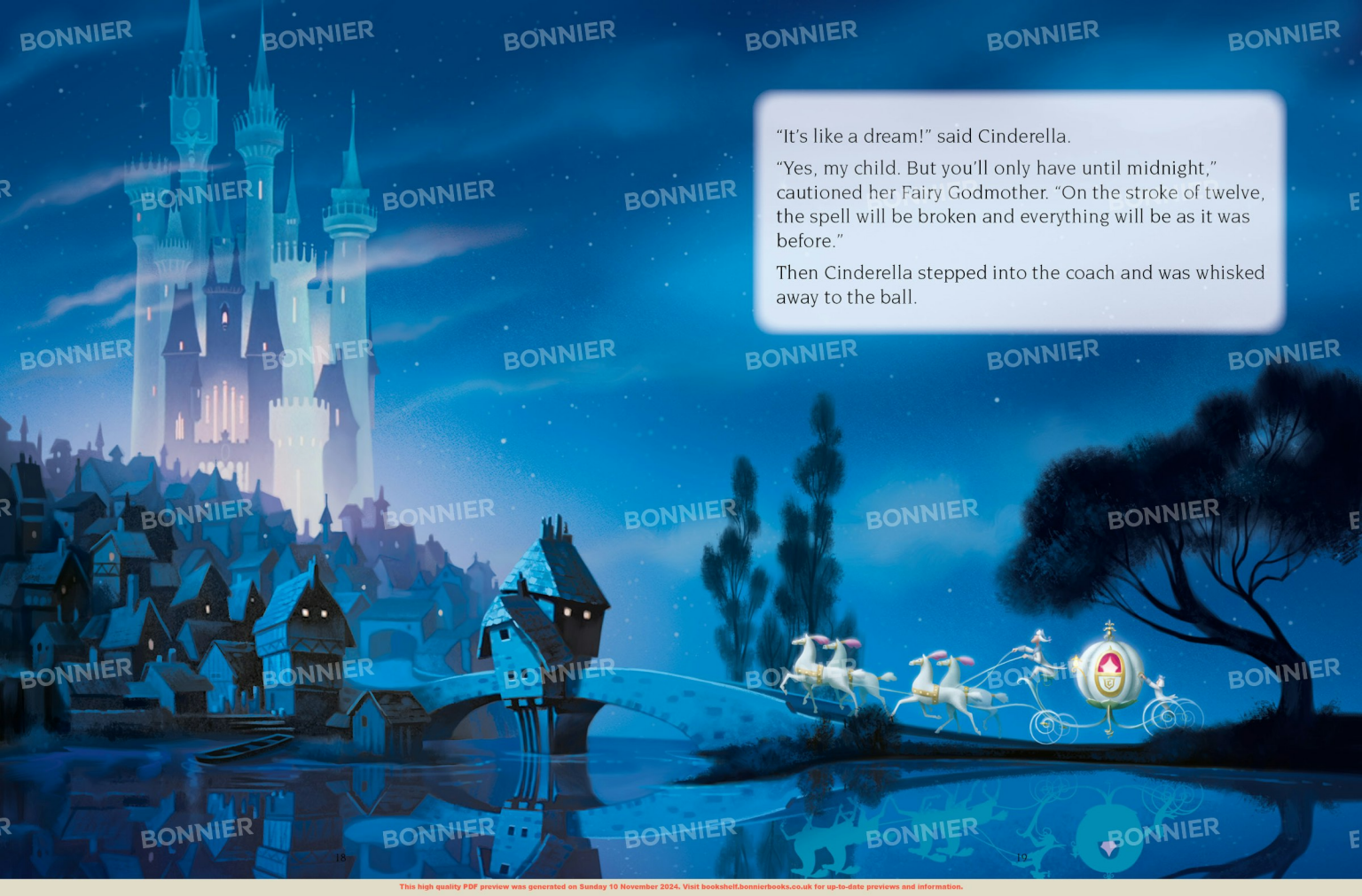

In the ballroom, no one recognised Cinderella. When the Prince asked her to dance, she smiled and took his hand. They danced all night. It was like a dream.

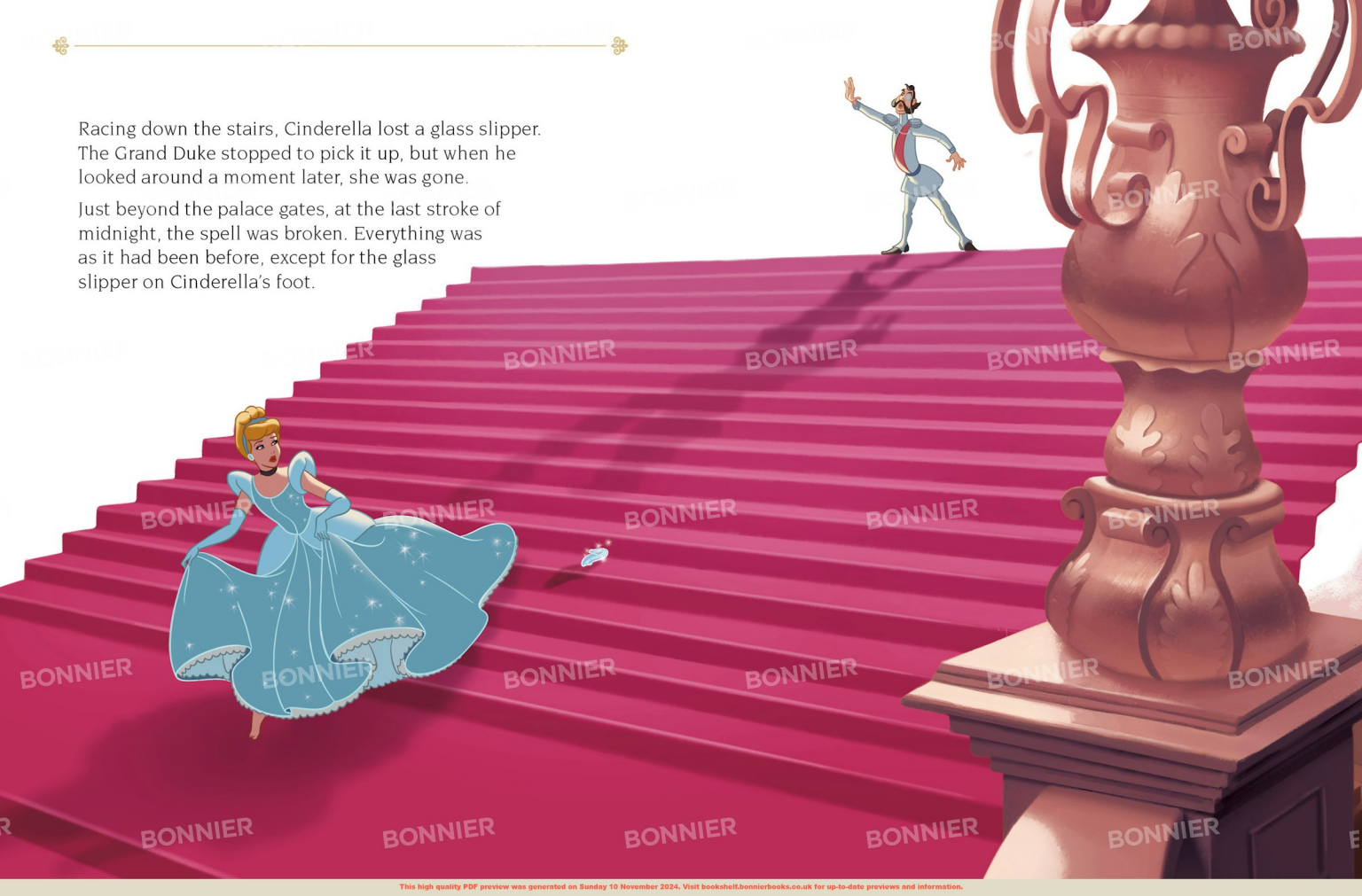
Suddenly, the clock began to strike twelve. "Oh, dear! It's midnight! I must leave," said Cinderella.

The Grand Duke knelt before Cinderella and eased the slipper onto her dainty foot. It was a perfect fit!



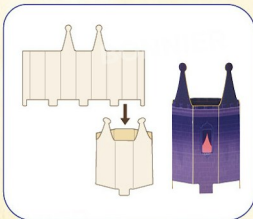
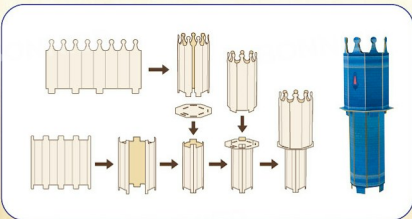
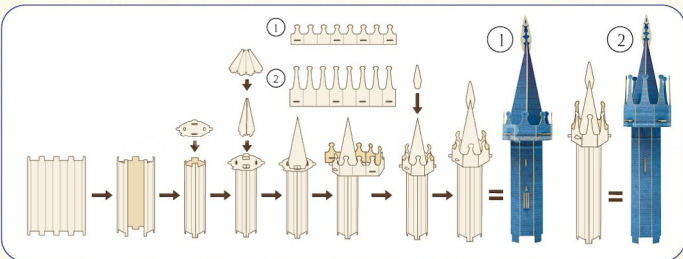
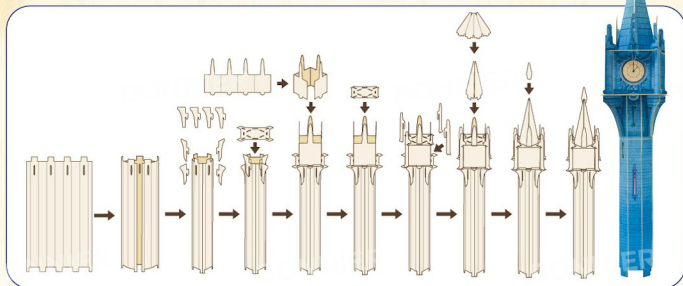


Soon Cinderella and the Prince were married, to the delight of the King and all of Cinderella's animal friends. And they all lived happily ever after!



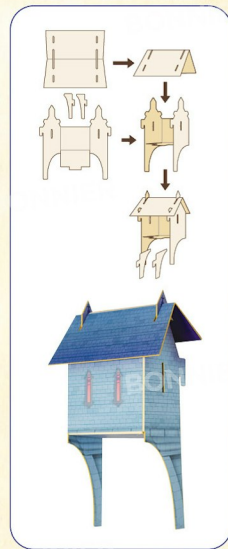
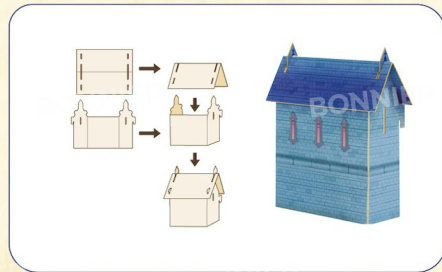
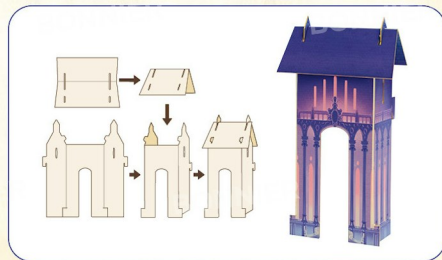
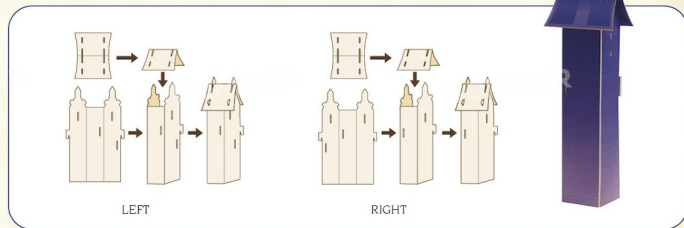

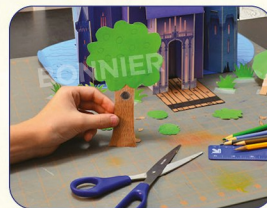
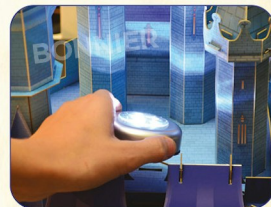


CUSTOMIZING THE CASTLE

In addition to assembling the elements of your castle in different configurations, there are many ways to make the castle your own.

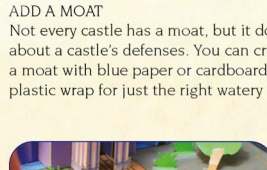
ADD LIGHTS

Lights always increase drama. Aim flashlights strategically for an exciting change of pace. If you have coloured lights, even better!



ADD LANDSCAPING

What do you think would be around a castle? Are there trees, grass, or pavement? Are there wild animals, farm animals, or pets? You can use materials at hand, like felt, sandpaper, or fabric pom-poms to create the setting of your dreams.



ADD A MOAT

Not every castle has a moat, but it doesn't hurt to think about a castle's defenses. You can create the look of a moat with blue paper or cardboard, and top it with plastic wrap for just the right watery shimmer.



MAKE A NEW TOWER

Do you want a different tower, or roof, or crenellation? Use a model piece like a stencil. Carefully remove it from your castle, then trace and cut out the outline using a sturdy piece of cardboard. Or, create your own model piece, using the same size tabs and slots. Insert into your model for a fully customized castle.
