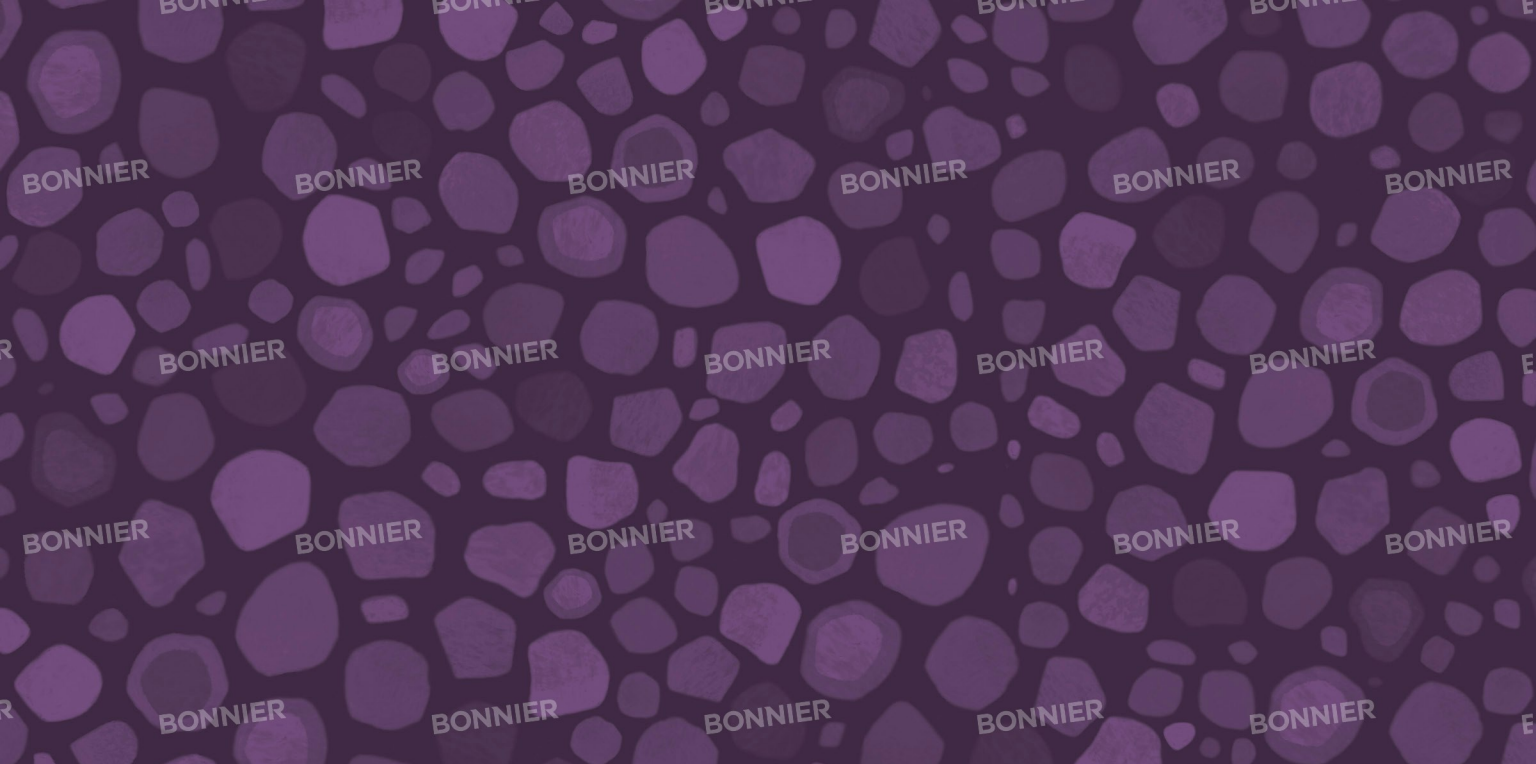

“I’m sorry,” said Mazu. “This is all my fault.”

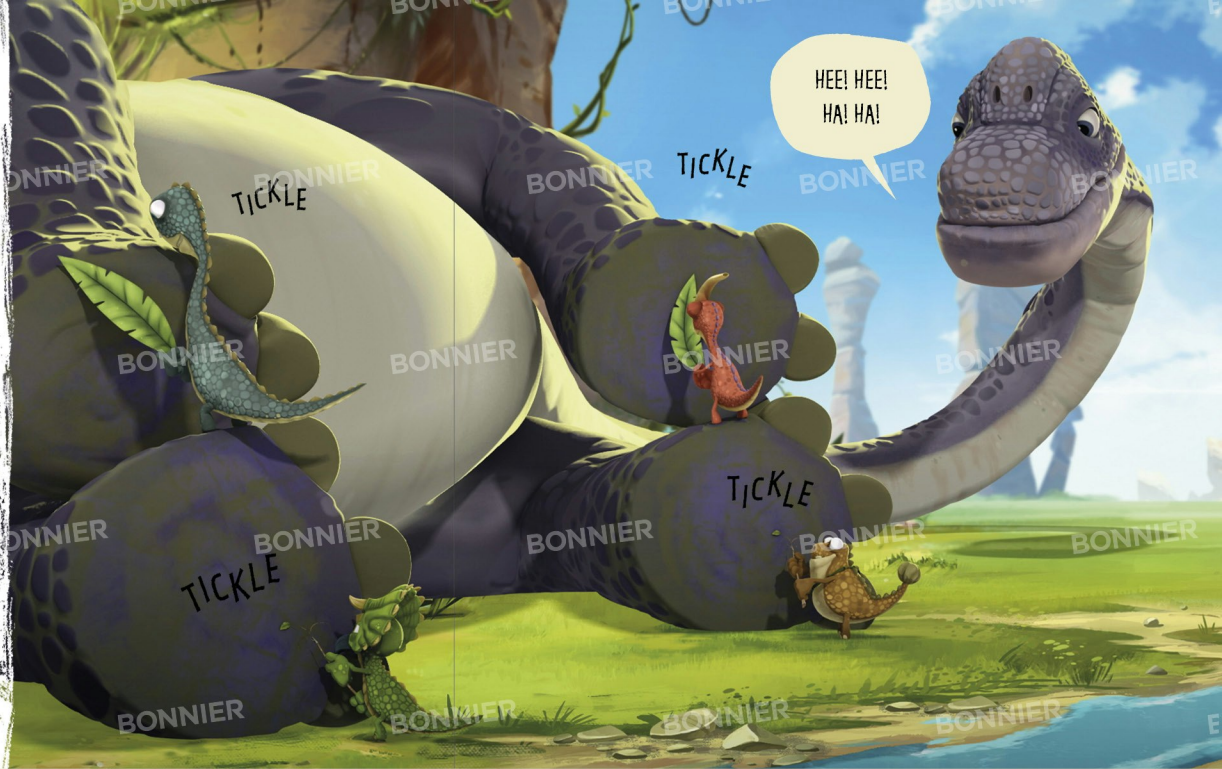
“It was an accident, dear,” Ayati told Mazu. “Who knew that I was so ticklish?”
