And above all else, try not to end up with "Nul Points"!

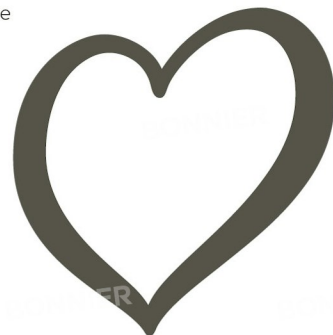


SPECIALIST SUBJECTS
