










This sign is up in the big tree! "I see it!" says Rabbit.





























"But I'm wearing my shoes," says Squirrel.


Everyone looks a bit confused.

Do they make you excited, or make you feel worried? Can you think of a time when you were surprised?






"You're right," says Mrs Owl. "Treasure comes in many forms, and nature is full of treasures. What a lot of acorns you've found. What are you going to do with them all?"





A smooth rock








A feather

You could make a 'journey stick' and gather things as you go just like Rabbit!


