Within the pages of this book, you will find the answer to precisely one of these questions.

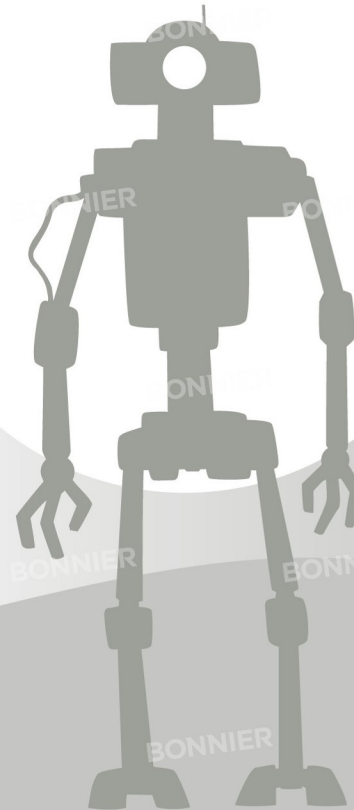
