INTRODUCTION

This book has 100 challenges for you and your brain, and you can try them any time when you are on – or even just thinking about – a vacation (or even if you aren't). You can solve

these puzzles while you are sitting on a sofa, lolling on lounger or chilling in a car. They provide a great way to pass time when you are waiting in a queue, when you are alone or even with other people.

There are many puzzle types in this book, all with

a theme of holidays and all of them featuring characters from your favourite Disney movies. Some are visual - you will have to look for differences. in images. Some are word puzzles, where you must think about your vocabulary spellina. There mathematical puzzles - yes, you'll have to add stuff up! And there are also logic puzzles, where your brain will need to work hard to resolve them. There are even a few riddles, designed to make you think outside the box - or the swimming pool, depending on where you are.

Solving puzzles should be a challenge, but above all it should be fun, so if you get stuck on one puzzle just move on to another and come back later. Or ask a friend to help – solving puzzles can be a great group activity.

So, have fun, wherever your holiday takes you, whether that is to a beach, a ski slope, a mountain or just at home in an armchair!












