Q is for **quiet**, please.



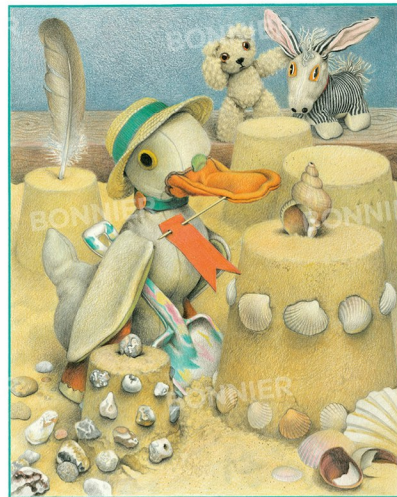
Old Bear is sleeping under his **quilt**.
