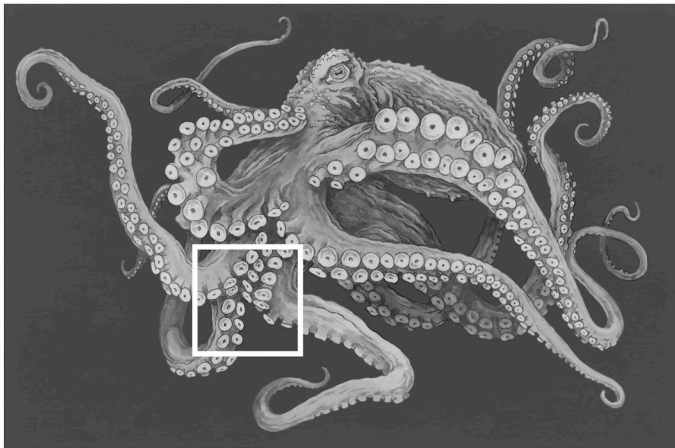

Giant Pacific octopus
