Birth of a dragon



Draw a large oval for the egg.

Draw two curved lines to indicate the neck,

Draw an oval

shape for the

dragon's head.

Add the basic wing shapes using curved lines.





Scales


The dragon's scales overlap each other in rows. You can see the tip of each scale but its base is covered by the one overlapping it.



Sleeping dragon

A dragon sleeping peacefully in its den makes for a very interesting composition.










Draw the basic shape of the face using straight lines.



Add simple shapes for the feet.




Sketch in a simple shape for each foot.



Add three toes and talons.



adding skin detail.




The wise dragon

Add the shape of the face using straight lines.

Add two long extending out from the body to become the tail.



Draw the shape of the legs using


Draw the main structure of the wings.

> Draw semi-circles on the end of each leg to place the feet.

Add the scaly

skin.

body.



Complete the head's detail.

Add a small figure talking to the dragon to give a sense of its scale.




Perched dragon

This dragon is perched on a large rock waiting patiently for its next victim to appear.

Draw a circle for the head.

Draw two the neck,



Draw in the basic shape of the head.

> Draw a curved horn shape for the arm of the wing.

Add two overlapped ovals for the rear leg.



oval for the body.

> Remember when drawing the dragon's legs that shading helps define the muscle.

Draw in the front legs using simple shapes.
