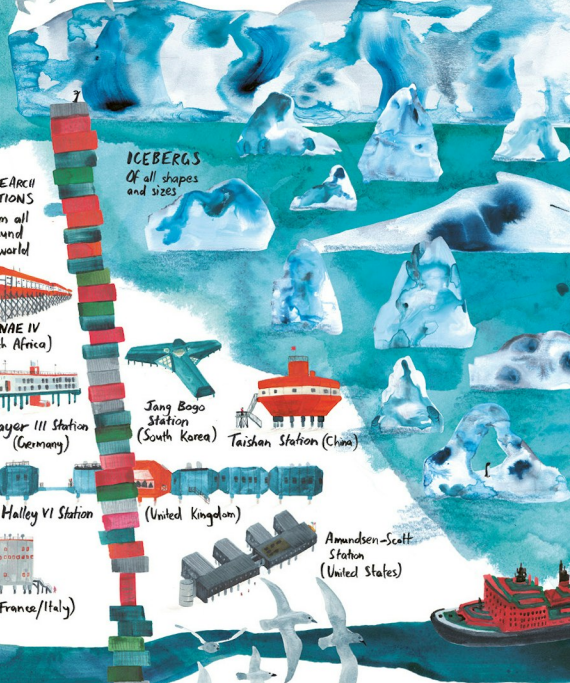

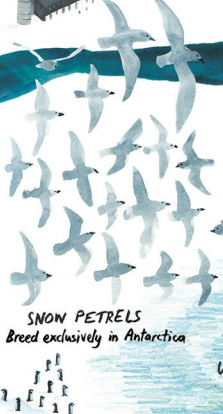


SHIPPING CONTAINERS

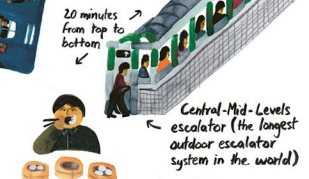

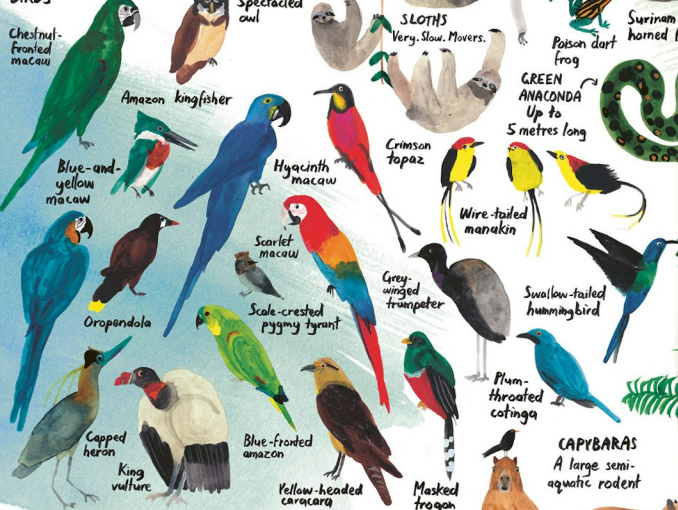

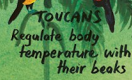

16,000 different species of trees



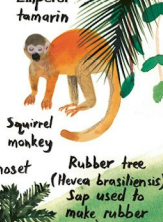
KINKAJOU

The third largest cat in the world

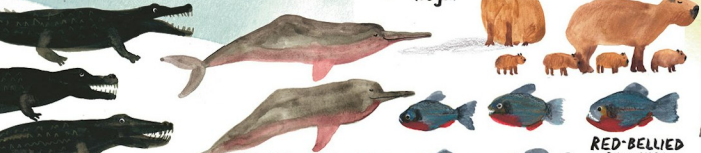
Walking palm / cashapona (Socratea exorrhiza)

A great place to enjoy a refreshing drink

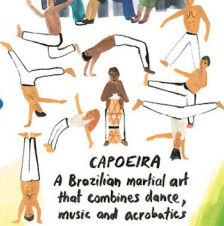


RIO CARNIVAL

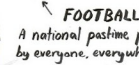

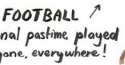
