He's on his way to work...



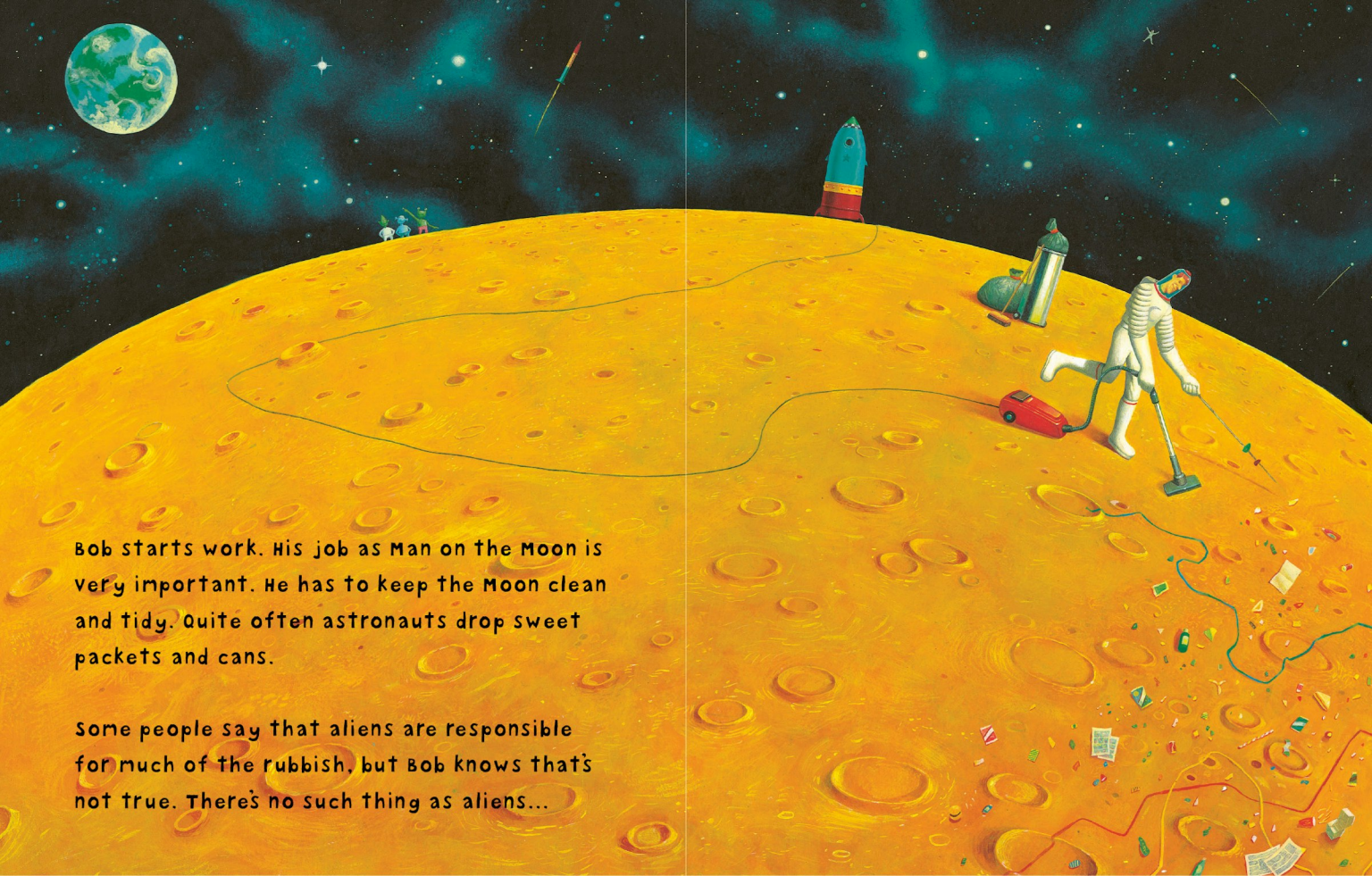


By eight o'clock Bob arrives at the launch-pad, changes into his special Man on the Moon suit and boards his fantastic rocket ship.
