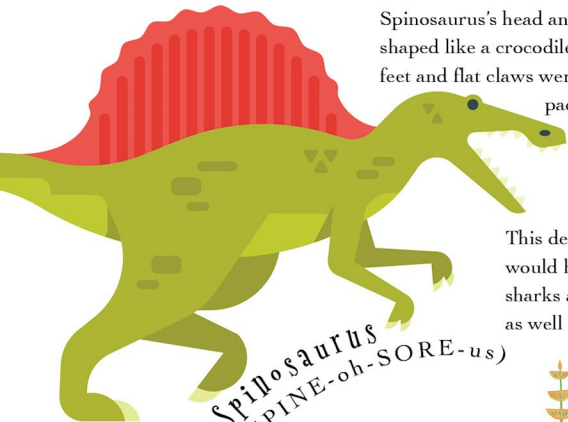




What was the deadliest dinosaur?

Spinosaurus was the largest meat-eating dinosaur known to have existed. Unlike other dinosaurs, Spinosaurus must have been **semi-aquatic** (partly water-dwelling).



Spinosaurus's head and teeth were shaped like a crocodile's. Its broad feet and flat claws were ideal for paddling in water.

This deadly dinosaur would have eaten sharks and crocodiles, as well as land animals.

(SPINE-oh-SORE-us)

Spinosaurus was 16.8 metres (55 feet) long. It was bigger than a Tyrannosaurus rex but was not as smart.
