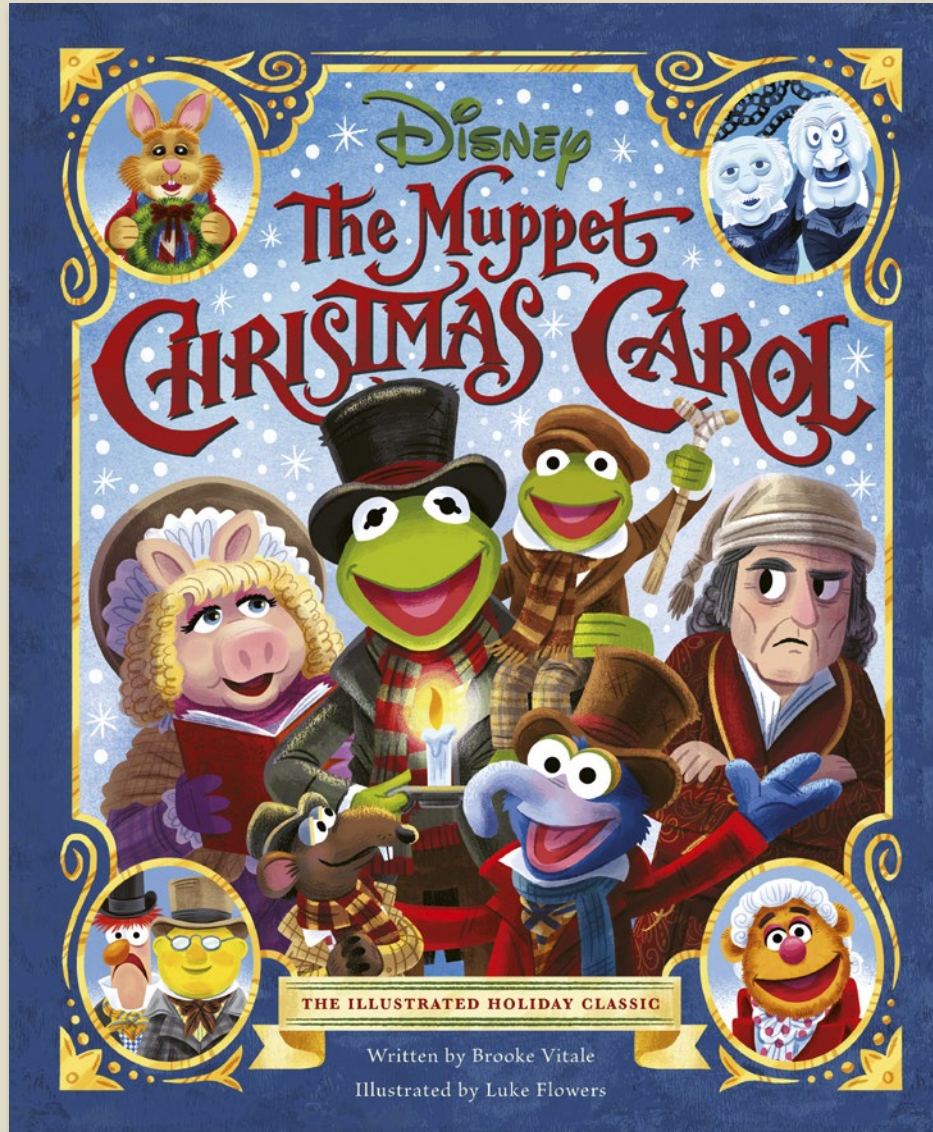


Disney: The Muppet Christmas Carol



A beautifully illustrated retelling of the festive favourite, *Disney The Muppet Christmas Carol!*

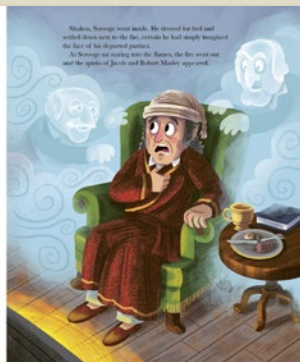
- Based on the beloved film adaptation of the Charles Dickens Christmas classic from director Brian Henson.

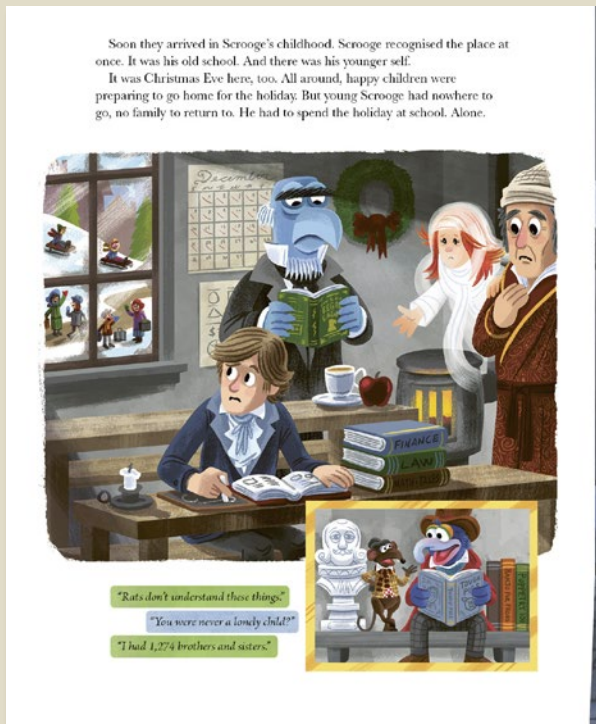

The spirit told Scrooge that the first spirit to come from the Marley's world. She offered to Scrooge her hand and pointed to the world made by children's eyes in wonder.

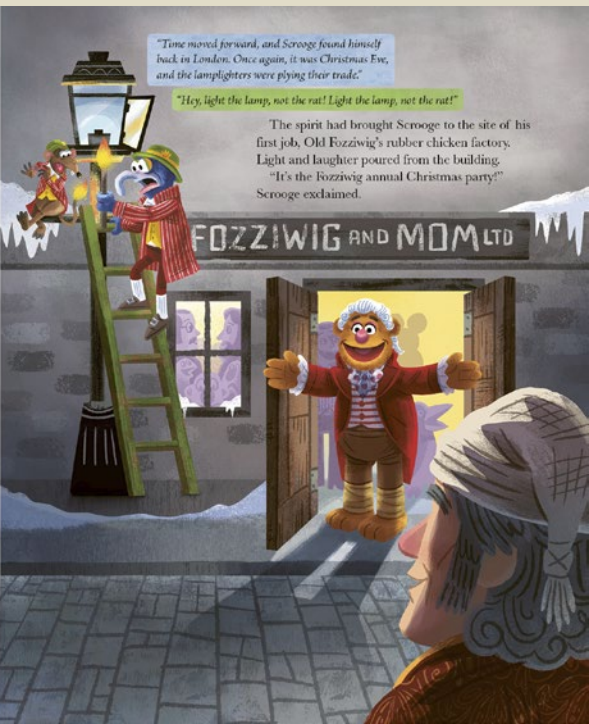
Scrooge hesitated to step into this air, but the spirit argued that he should be safe. He took her hand and they flew out the window and into the past.
