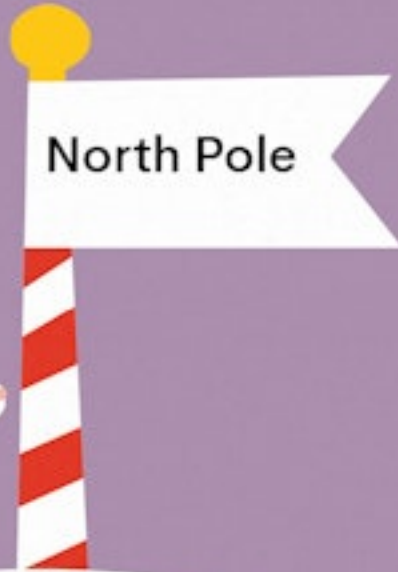
Our planet is full of life.




This is because

at the top...



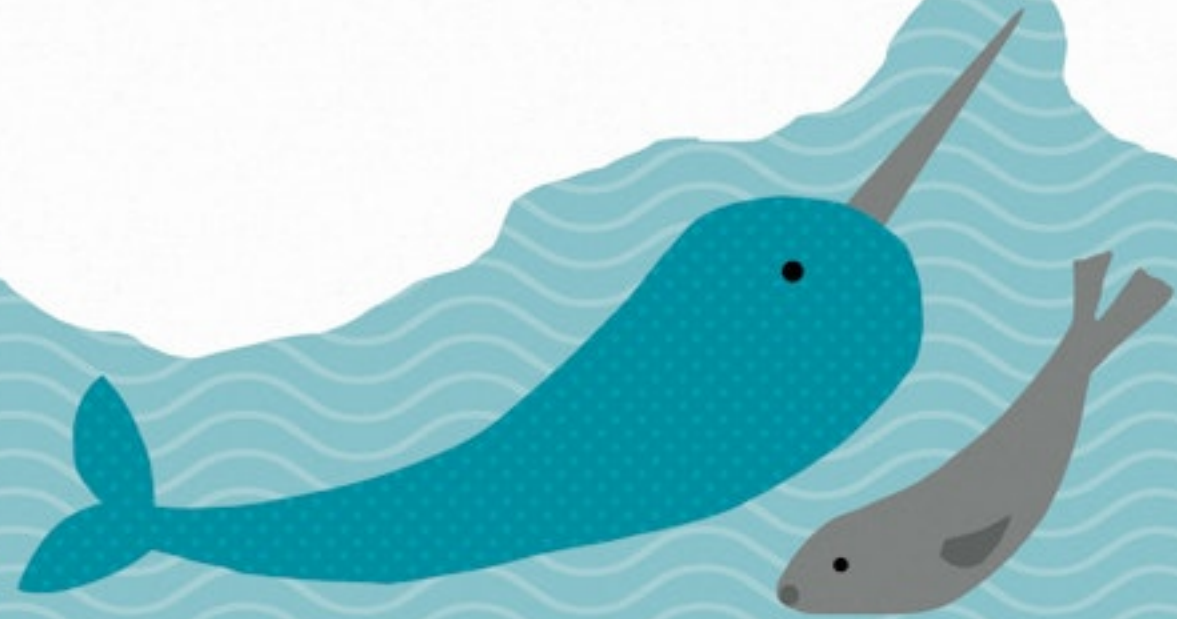
... and at the bottom of planet Earth.

... penguins!

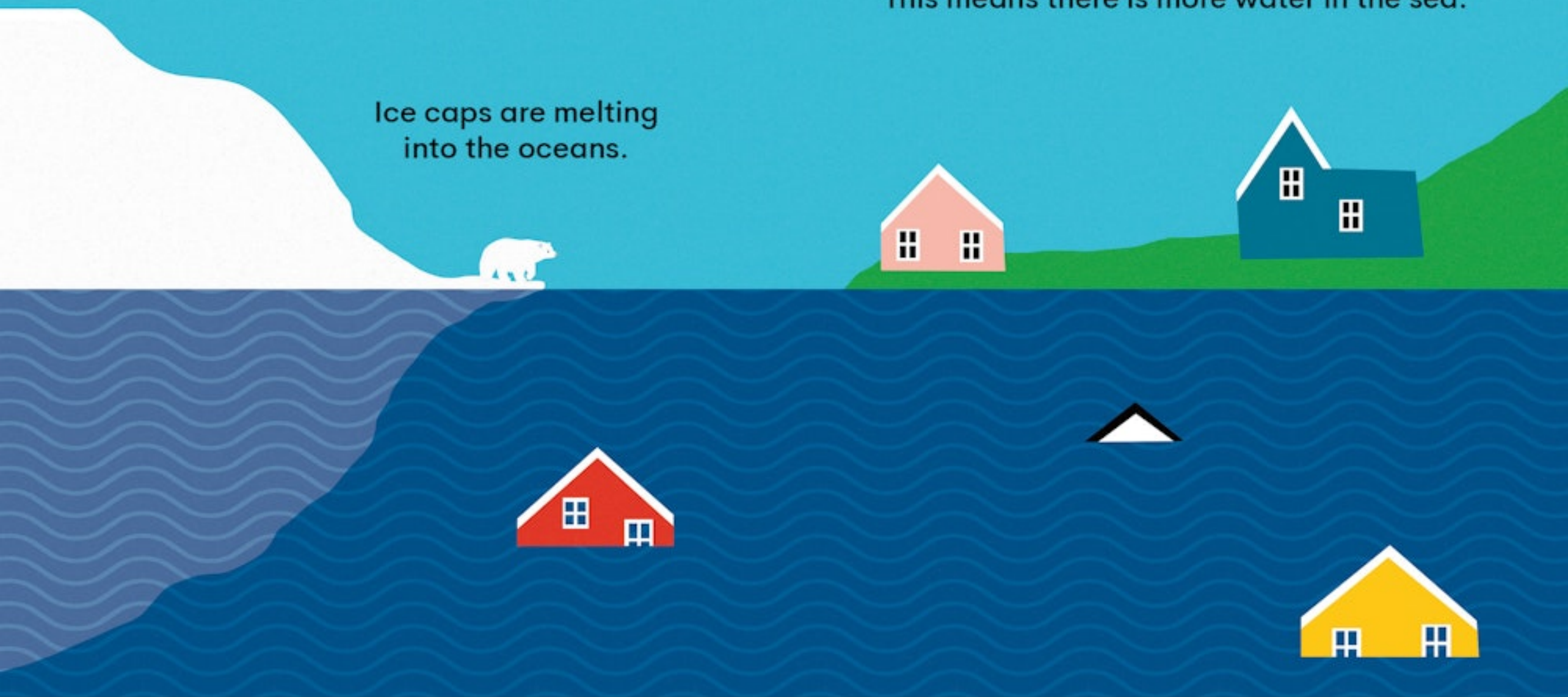
Earth is getting warmer

can do to help!

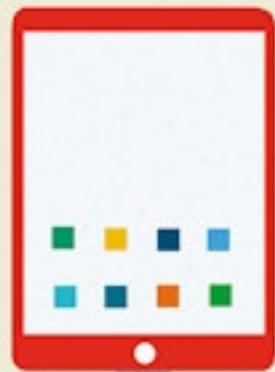
Walk, take the bus
