and for Dad, who is allergic – A.S.

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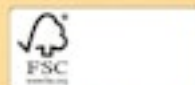
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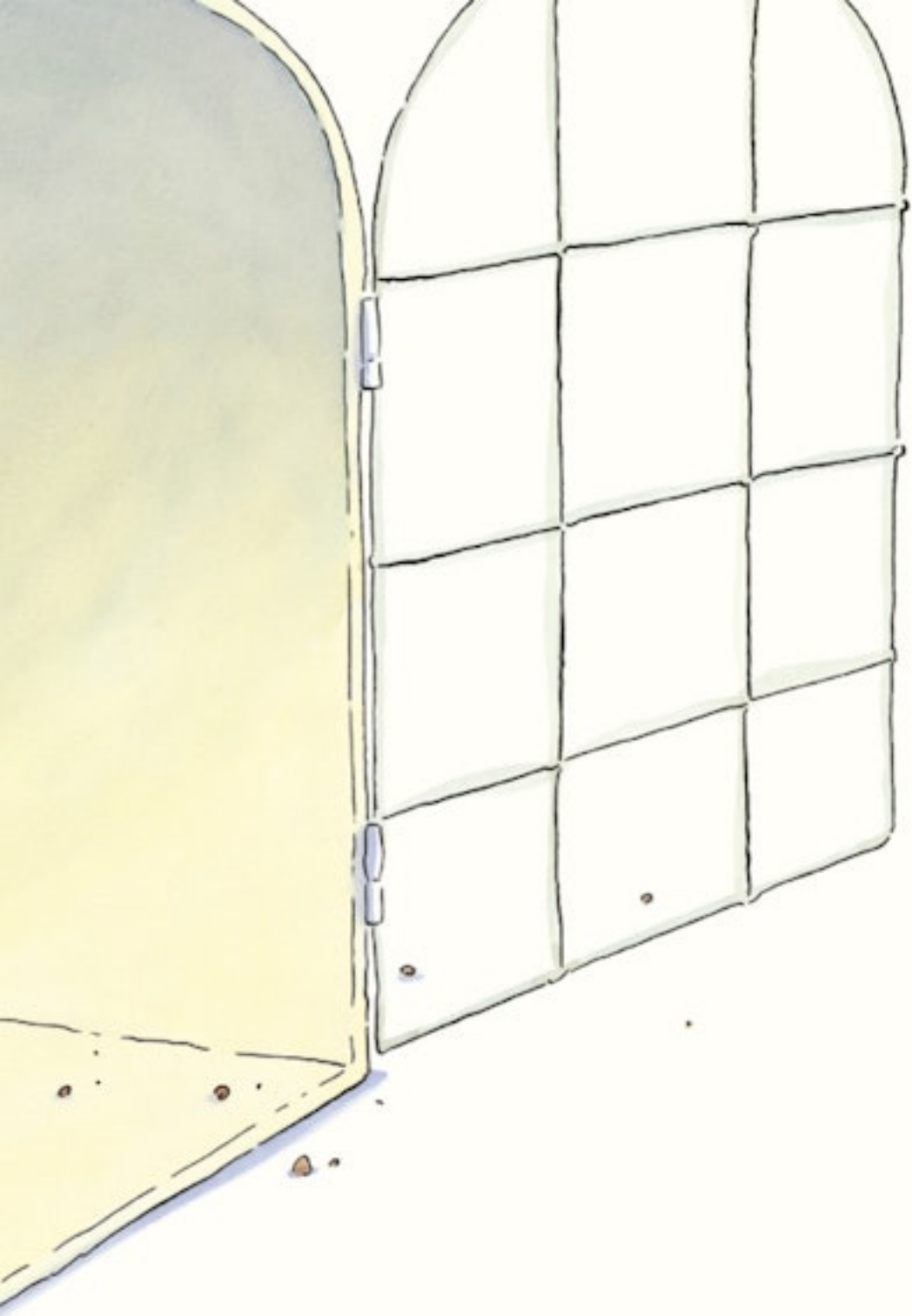
Naughty Kitty!

It was a catastrophe





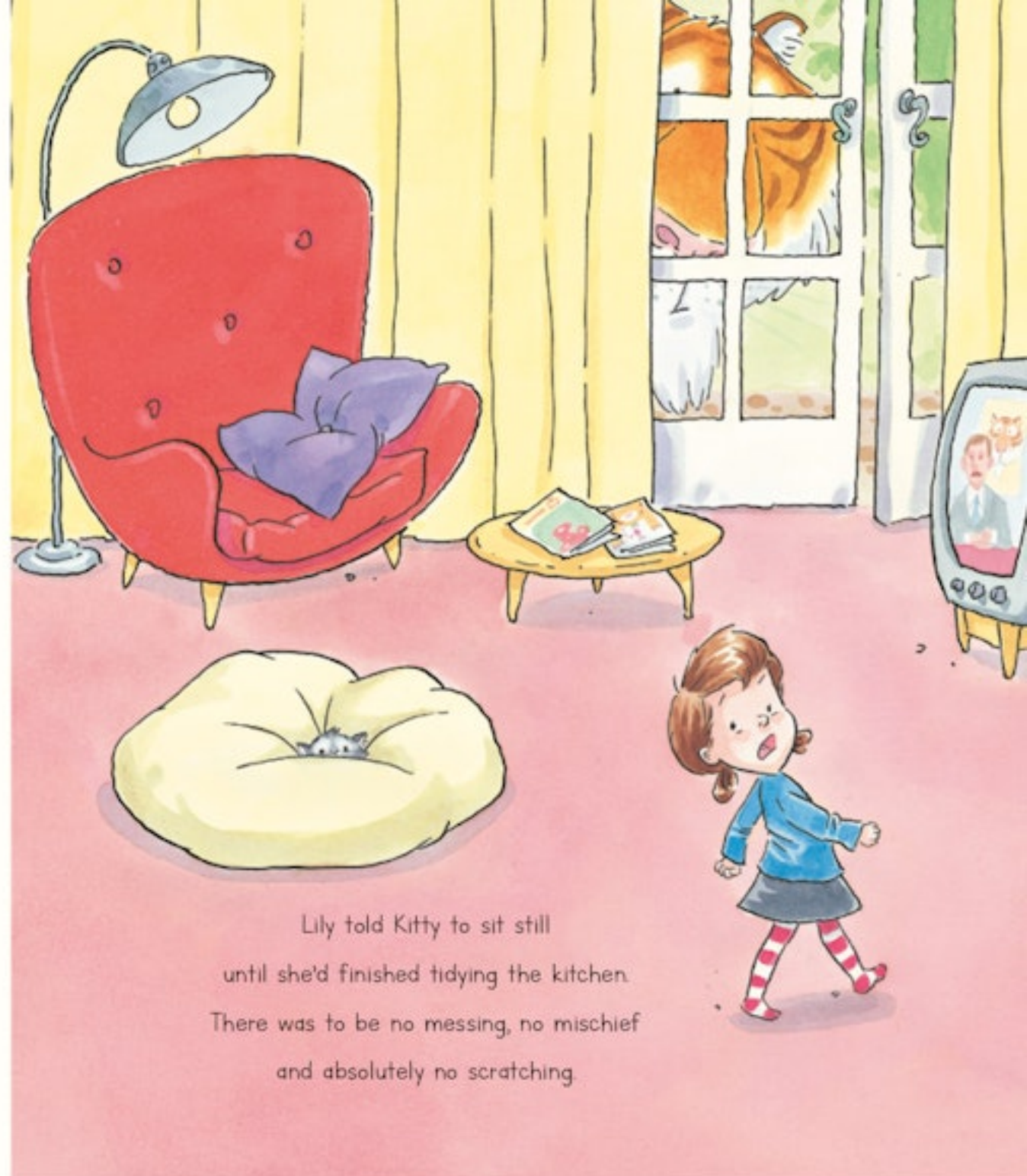


What a mess!

a whole bowl of Kittibix!




Lily told Kitty to sit still
