the maze?

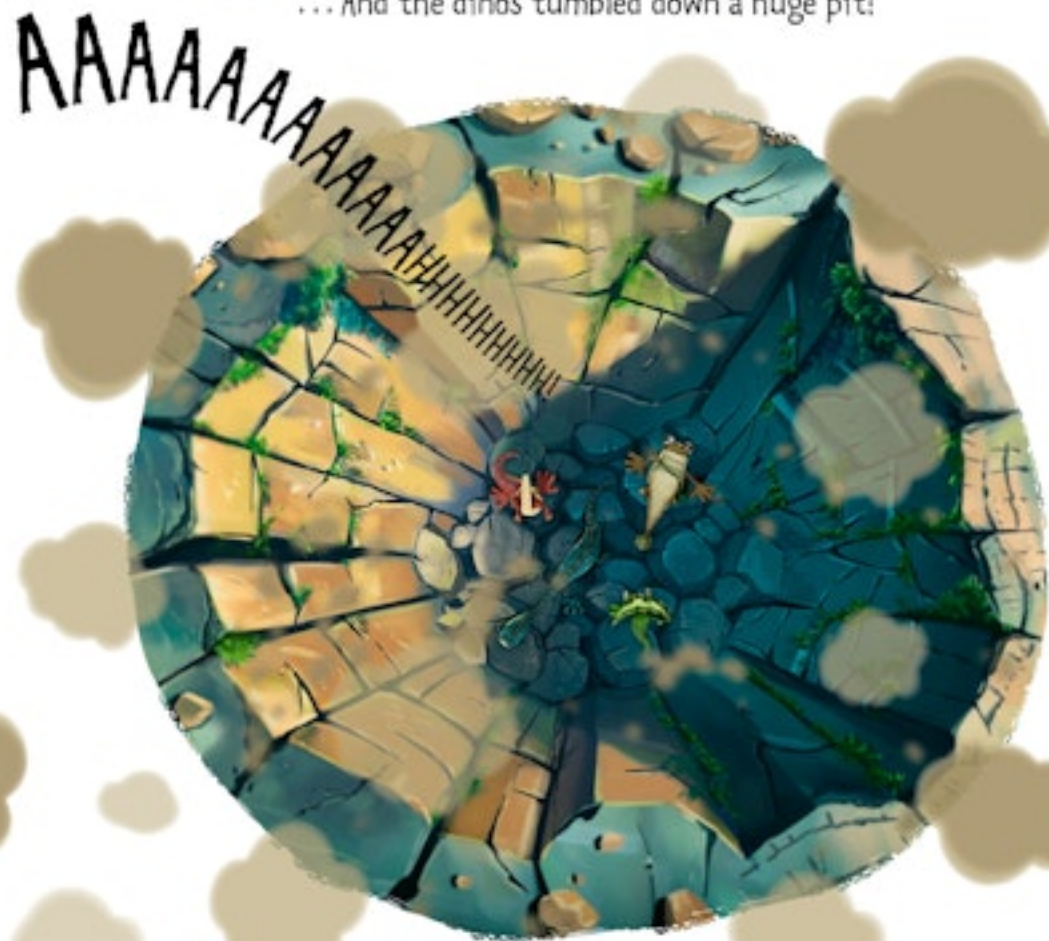


"Who could master *all* those things?" Bill gulped.

"Which way should we go?" asked Tiny.

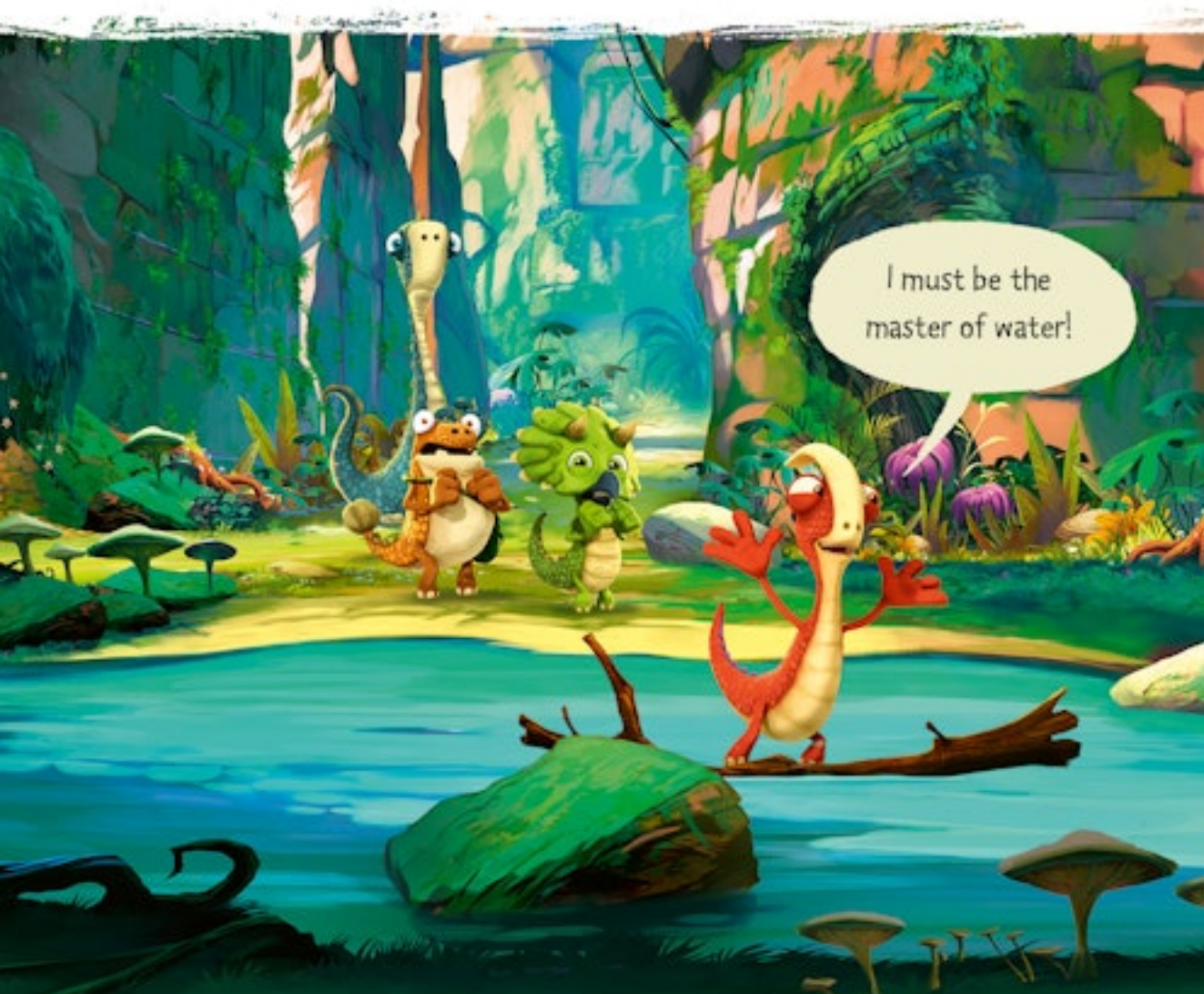
"That way!" yelled Rocky, who had seen Giganto walk along the left path.
