favourite fruit.







As Bill thought about Cror's cunning plan, Tiny and Dilo charged ahead and pushed their boulder to victory.




"Nooo, the prize is slipping away!" Cror cried, furiously.

They rushed over to find the other dinos in big trouble they were trying to cross the old bridge!




Suddenly, the rickety bridge snapped in two!
