identical stripes?



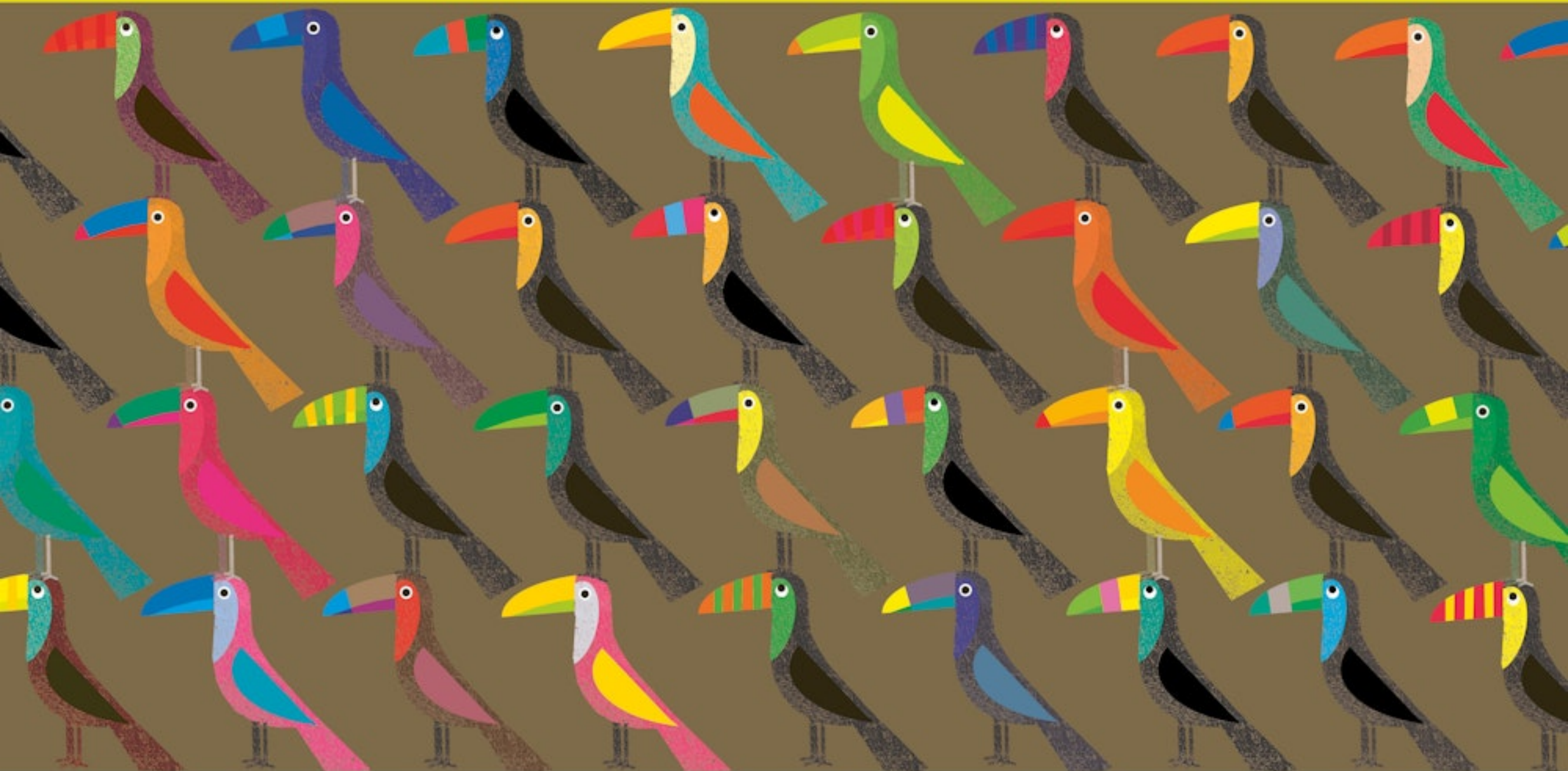
A romp of otters
