EYEWEAR

Eyeglasses may seem commonplace today, but it has taken hundreds of years to develop them to where they are now, helped by a series of inventions along the way. The ancient Romans first wrote about using glass beads to read. similar to how reading glasses work today. However, it was the Arab scientist Al-Hasan Ibn al-Haytham, a man known as the 'father of modern optics', who first wrote about using convex (outwards curved) lenses to magnify an image. Eventually, Ibn al-Haytham's literature made its way to Western Europe. and translations of his work led to glass 'reading stones' becoming common. The Italians improved further on these stones to create the first eveglasses in the late 1200s.



for glasses to become lighter and more durable. The colour of lenses has changed too, creating the first purpose-built sunglasses. These work by adding cerium oxide (a type of chemical compound) into the glass to filter out harmful ultraviolet light from the sun. Sunglasses quickly became fashionable, and in 1938, it was reported that 20 million sunglasses had been sold the year before in the US. Interestingly, only a quarter of those people needed sunglasses for medical reasons. This development is an example of a product that was initially designed to benefit a few but ended up benefitting many. It is testament to the importance of innovation within the disabled community.

STEAM AND ELECTRIC AUTOMOBILES

Since their invention in the early 1800s, steam locomotives revolutionised the way people and freight were transported. However, some travellars wanted a more convenient vehicle that they didn't have to shore and could use whenever they wanted. Some engineers created small, steam-powered road vehicles, while others docided to try electric battery automobiles. Many designs were created, but by the early 20th century it was clear that the internal combustion engine was going to be king of the road.

The first steam-powered read vehicle was designed by English investor Richard Travitistic, Using a high-presenter bodier for more power, his Puffing David set off with aix passengers in 1601 at a speed described by one witness at Yater than Lood walk (about Skm/h). Unfortunately, only a few days after this historic journay, the bodier caught fire and Puffing Devi was storayed.

Electric cars were very popular in Europe and the USA from the late 1800s to the early 1900s. They were quieter and smoother, dich's produce smoke and were easier to use than steampowered automobile. One of the last and most advanced steam automobiles was the Doble steam car Designed in 1924, the Doble Model E only required 30 seconds to boil the water needed to drive the engine, was easy to control and outid reach speeds as high as 120 km/h.



The age of the automobile really began with the invention of the internal combustion angine. When fuels such as petrol, diesel or kerosene are burned (or 'combusted') inside the engine (using an availter such as ain), the y produce kinetic energy, which makes the vehicle move. Internal combustion engines are more fuel-efficient than steam engines, and proved for easier and more convenient to start-up, operate and maintain.

German inventor Karl Benz developed the first automobile powered by an internal combustion engine in 1895. His revolutionary Motornagen had a 3hp petrol ergine, three-poked wheels with solid rubber tyres and one forward gear. Its top speed was around 18km/h.

The first mas-produced car was the Cidsmobile Model R Curved Dask; 19,000 wore built become 1001 and 1007. It was more affordable than most other cars at the time, had a 5kp engine, 2 forward and 1 rowers gearand care as either 2 -seater 'runabout' or a 4-seater family car.

Created in 1901 by German engineers Paul Daimter and Wilhelm Maybach as a racing car, the Mercodes S5 HP was a huge stop forward in automobile design. It had a powerful petrol engine mounted at the front that drove the back wheels, a hand brake and a foot brake, 4 forward gaars and 1 reverse gaar.
