Pygmy Seahorse

As its name suggests, the pygmy woodhoopoe is very tiny indeed, typically measuring just a centimetre or two in length.

The Barghini's pygmy antelope has evolved to be so wonderfully well camouflaged that a woman's dressmaker and the late 1900s, it was only spotted when a scientist who was studying a piece of ivory found the tiny animal clinging to it to a branch. Today, there are now known species of pygmy antelope, seven of which live in the Great Triangle of Southern Asia. In 2008, the *Myapoceros pygmaeus* (also known as the "Japan pig") was discovered on the coast of Japan. More recently, in 2010, *Myapoceros nalis*, also known as the African pygmy antelope, was discovered in South Africa.

Sperm Whale

The whale has been the stuff of myth and legend for as long as humans have ventured across the world's oceans. Looking at the sperm whale, it's easy to see why.

The sperm whale is truly awe-inspiring. It is one of the largest toothed predators in the world, measures around 15 meters or more in length, and weighs around 40 tonnes more. Some have been recorded as being much larger, but these giant whales are very rare. The sperm whale has several unique adaptations that make it not just a whale species.



The information, which you may have referred to as noise, allows the whale to produce sounds, such as clicks and whistles, that travel through the water, either up, right, or are reflected back to the whale. This then allows these reflected sounds to carry the information to locate the object the sound bounced off. Some animals use noise in the air rather than in the water – bats, for example (see page 55). To produce its vocal sounds, the sperm whale has phonic lips in its nose. As you push through the nasal passage and past the phonic lips, the surrounding tissue vibrates, producing the loudest sounds of any animal.

The sperm whale's magnificent head, which takes up almost a third of its body, is always entirely devoted to noise. Within it, it'll find a huge vacuum containing an air-filled head filled government. Yes, along with other complex brain fluid

There are four-filled creatures known as whale's a ballroom, producing large, dark, not in evidence for the whale, when it comes into contact with other animals. This creature was formerly known as the seal, the member of the whale-like group, which, according to the legend, was the second member of the whale-like group.

For a long period of time, spermatozoa, a highly flammable substance, was used to fuel lamps. The burning of this oil led to the heating of sperm whales in large numbers, causing many populations to become so rare that whale hunting was stopped in the late 1950s. Unfortunately, some reactions continue to engage in this practice. Whales are also threatened by climate change and pollution, as well as becoming entangled in commercial fishing nets.

Bat-Eared Fox

The name explains it all: a fox with ears like a bat. But why has this extraordinary animal developed such unusual features?

Living in small, tightly knit social groups, these foxes make their home on the savannahs of eastern and southern Africa. This is a dry and hot landscape where food is limited and danger is ever-present. The fox's large ears are an adaptation shared by many other inhabitants of these kinds of environments, such as the fennec fox, showing how evolution works to find the most efficient 'solution' to the problem of survival (bearing in mind that nothing is ever 'finished' in evolution – it's a constant work in progress).

In the case of a fox, its specialized ears serve several purposes. Firstly, they give it an astonishing sense of hearing. Not only does this allow the fox to detect predators and keep itself safe, but it also helps it to be a predator itself. It consumes a wide range of prey, including metals, spiders and millipedes, and occasionally even small reptiles and mammals – all of which are elusive, fast and, more often than not, actually hidden, at the very or sheltered underground. In such situations, the ability to hear your dinner before you see it makes it a lot easier to locate. Bat-eared foxes can hear even when walking slowly with their noses to the ground (their sense of smell is also extremely sensitive), their huge ears cocked forward, listening for the tiny scratch of an insect in its burrow. Once the fox has located its prey, it swiftly digs it up and can seize its target. Specialized teeth make it easy to crunch through the (often thick) carcase of its insect lunch.

The ears also serve another vital function, one that's particularly important if you live in a hot environment and you're covered in fur: heat regulation. Like those of the elephant (see page 48), the fox's ears serve as radiators. Because of the fine capillary veins close to the surface of its ears, the fox can remain at a comfortable temperature by venting excess heat from its blood into the air.

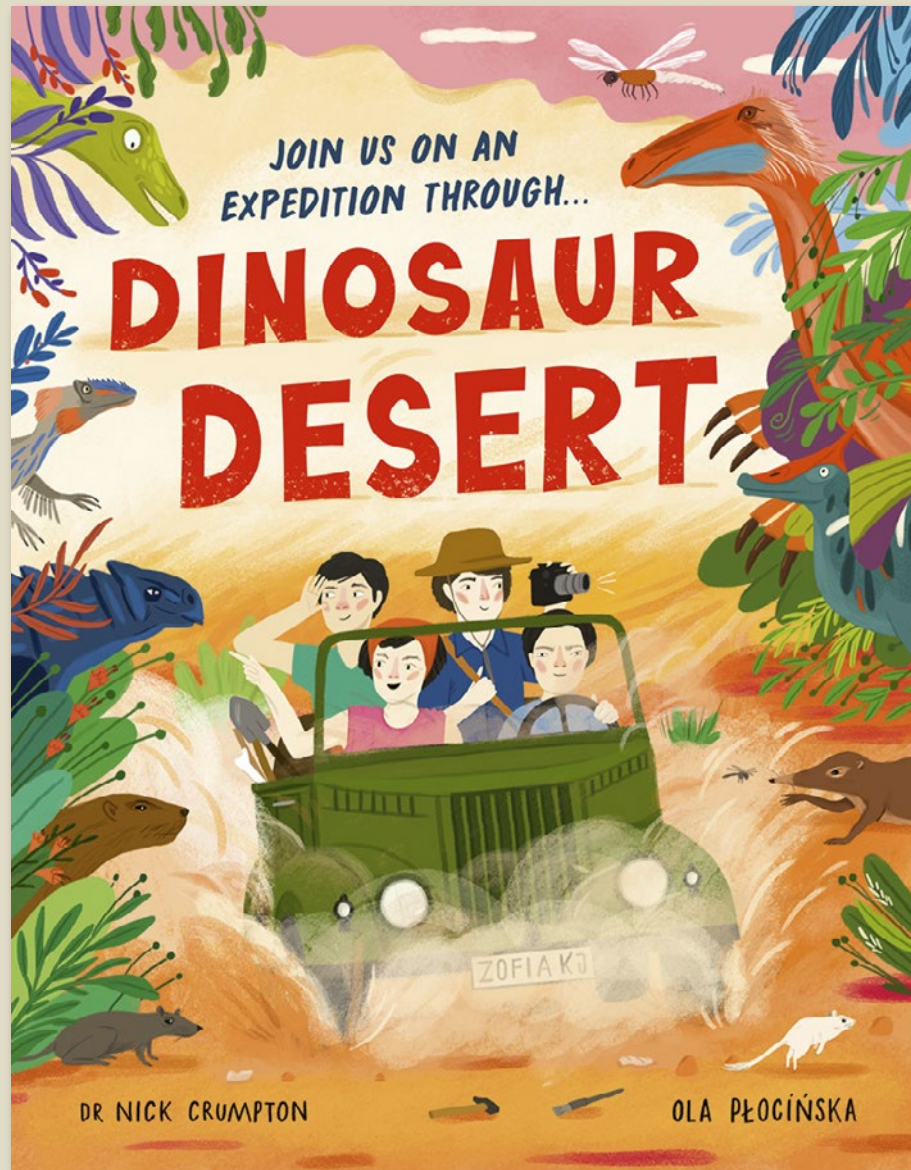
Apart from its large ears, the bat-eared fox also has more teeth than other species of fox (between 46 and 50 teeth in total). In fact, these unique creatures have more teeth than most mammals. Bat-eared fox has three upper and four lower molars on each side of the mouth, while other members of the canid (or dog) family have two upper and three lower molars. These extra teeth mean that the fox is perfectly adapted to chewing creepy crawlies.

Although occasionally hunted, the bat-eared fox is one of the increasingly rare examples of an animal with a safe conservation status. It is helpful in keeping down the number of termites, which are considered pests. This means that the biggest commercial value for humans comes from keeping these foxes alive. Most threats to this fox come from the dangers its food sources might face, such as flooding from damming or the use of insecticides.

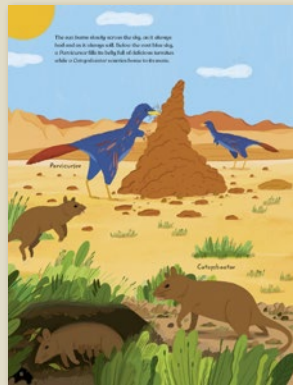

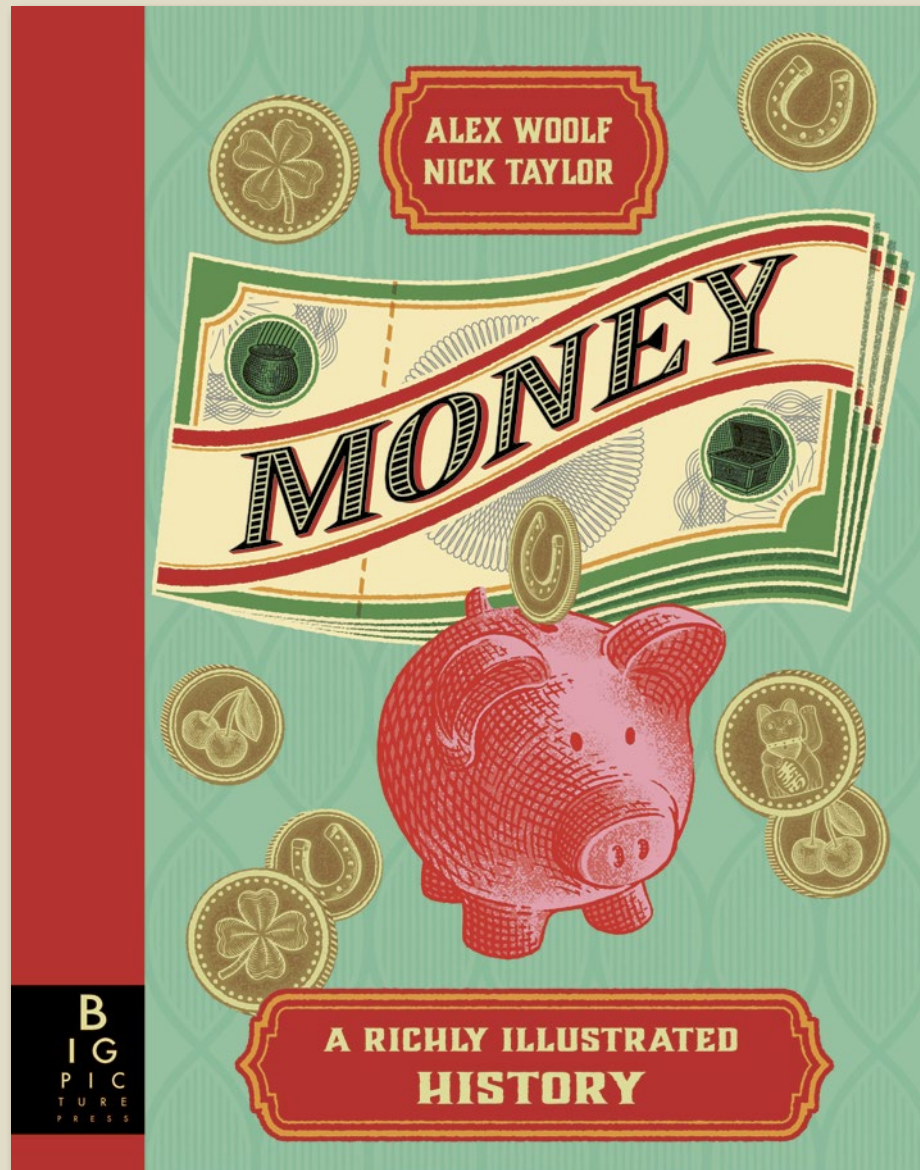

DISASTER

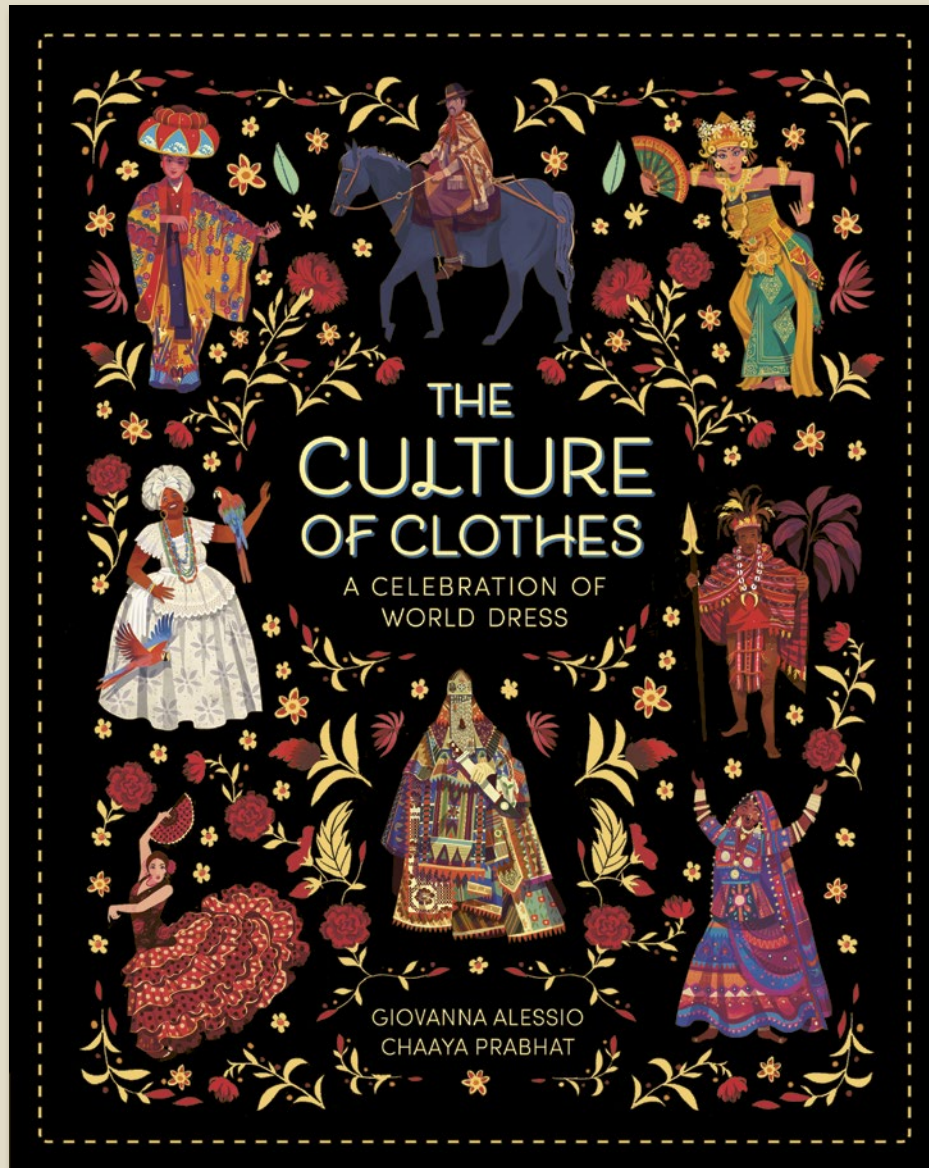
The crash occurred at the end of October 1929, during three calamitous days of trading at the New York Stock Exchange on Wall Street, when huge numbers of people decided collectively it was time to sell. With so many sellers, there were few buyers, and share prices plummeted. In those three days, billions of dollars were wiped off the value of American companies. And over the following years the market kept on falling. By 1932, stocks had lost nearly 90 per cent of their pre-crash value.

AFTER EFFECTS

As a result of the crash, businesses were bankrupted, banks closed, millions lost their jobs and the world plunged into a deep and lasting economic depression. This had a big political impact. In Europe, extreme right-wing parties exploited the misery of mass unemployment, blaming 'foreigners' such as Jews. Germany's Nazi Party rose to power in 1933. The consequences for the world would be devastating.

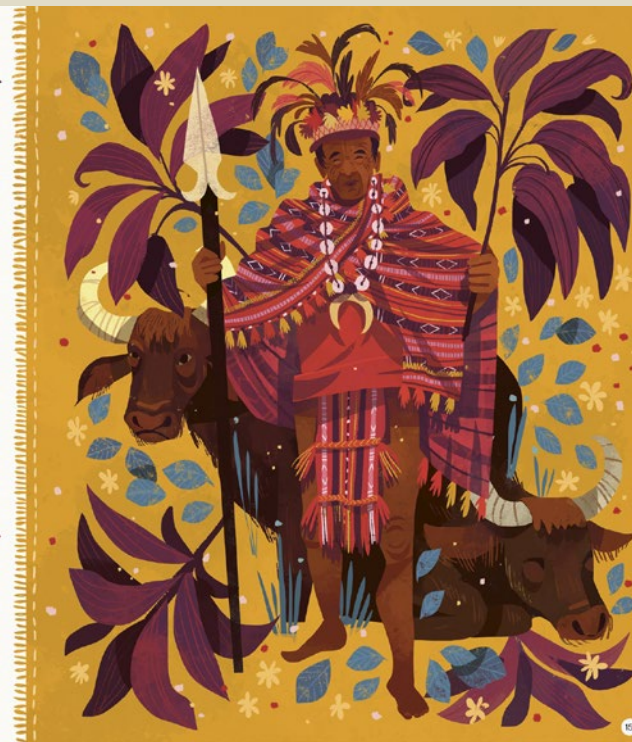
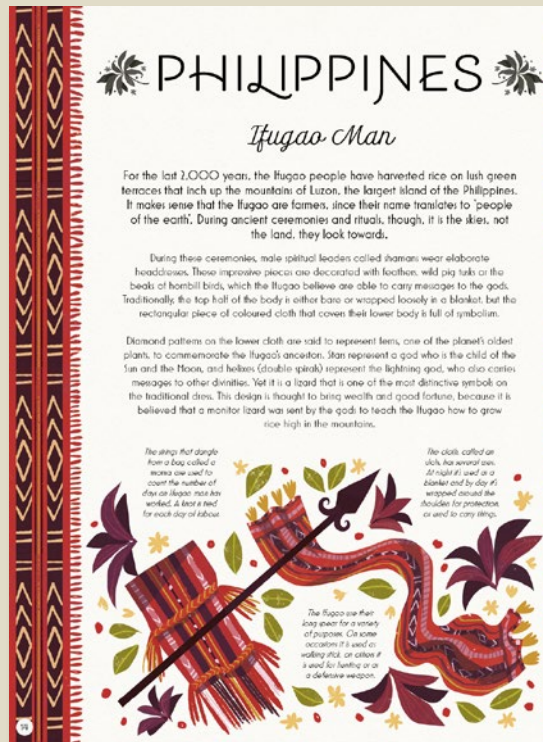

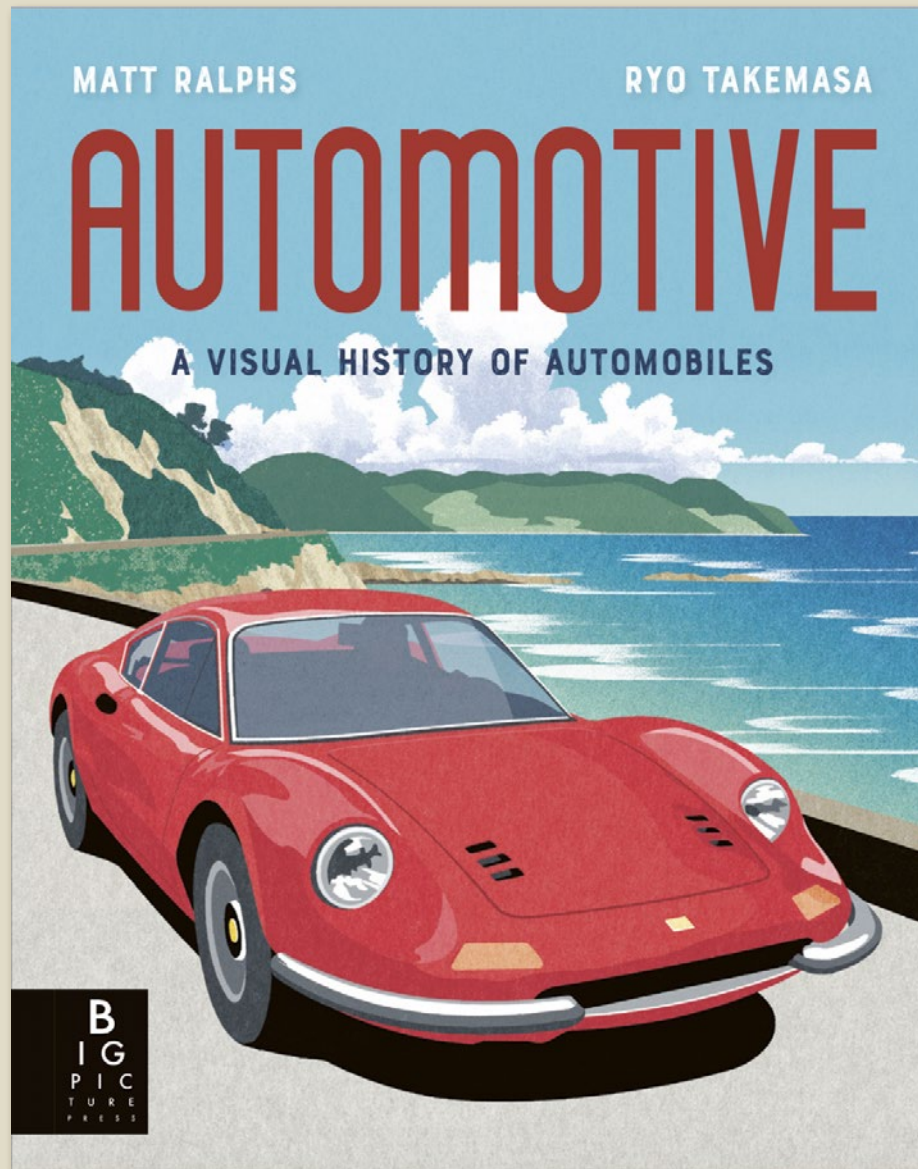

SAFETY FIRST

A tragic piece of history was made in 1909 when an Irish woman called Mary Ward became the first person killed by an automobile. While riding in an experimental open-top, steam-driven car, she fell out and was killed. Since then, designers have tried to make cars safer and easier to drive. Here are just some of the safety features found on modern automobiles.

Many routers can come with some (and/or no) features listed as standard. Routers provide the drive with their real-time traffic statistics, graphs, directions and up-to-date traffic information.

When adjacent headlights beam light approaching from the opposite direction, they automatically dip full beams to avoid blinding the driver. They also serve to follow spacing bands in the road.

TRUCKS

STEAM AND ELECTRIC AUTOMOBILES

Since their invention in the early 1800s, steam locomotives revolutionised the way people and freight were transported. However, some travellers wanted a more convenient vehicle that they didn't have to share and could use whenever they wanted. Some engineers created small, steam-powered road vehicles, while others decided to try electric battery automobiles. Many designs were created, but by the early 20th century it was clear that the internal combustion engine was going to be king of the road.

The first steam-powered road vehicle was designed by English inventor Richard Trevithick. Using a high-pressure boiler for more power, his Puffing Devil set off with six passengers in 1801 at a speed described by one witness as 'faster than I could walk' (about 6km/h). Unfortunately, only a few days after this historic journey, the boiler caught fire and Puffing Devil was destroyed.



Electric cars were very popular in Europe and the USA from the late 1800s to the early 1900s. They were quieter and smoother, didn't produce smoke and were easier to use than steam-powered automobiles. One of the first successful models was the Flocken Elektrowagen. Designed in Germany in 1888, its 1hp electric motor drove the back wheels and could reach around 15km/h.



One of the last and most advanced steam automobiles was the Doble steam car. Designed in 1924, the Doble Model E only required 30 seconds to boil the water needed to drive the engine, was easy to control and could reach speeds as high as 120km/h.

EARLY ENGINES

The age of the automobile really began with the invention of the internal combustion engine. When fuels such as petrol, diesel or kerosene are burned (or 'combusted') inside the engine (using an oxidizer such as air), they produce kinetic energy, which makes the vehicle move. Internal combustion engines are more fuel-efficient than steam engines, and proved far easier and more convenient to start-up, operate and maintain.

German inventor Karl Benz developed the first automobile powered by an internal combustion engine in 1885. His revolutionary Motorwagen had a 3hp petrol engine, three-spoked wheels with solid rubber tyres and one forward gear. Its top speed was around 16km/h.



The first mass-produced car was the Oldsmobile Model R Curved Dash; 19,000 were built between 1901 and 1907. It was more affordable than most other cars at the time, had a 5hp engine, 2 forward and 1 reverse gear and came as either a 2-seater 'runabout' or a 4-seater family car.



Created in 1901 by German engineers Paul Daimler and Wilhelm Maybach as a racing car, the Mercedes 35 HP was a huge step forward in automobile design. It had a powerful petrol engine mounted at the front that drove the back wheels, a hand brake and a foot brake, 4 forward gears and 1 reverse gear.
