From the our Sun, we have millions of stars, and planets and moons that orbit around them. Some are very hot and bright, while others are very cold and dark. Some are very large, while others are very small. Some are very close to us, while others are very far away.


STAR'S PROPERTIES Stars are classified by their temperature, size, and mass. The most common type of star is a main sequence star, like our Sun.

PLANETS AND MOONS Planets are large objects that orbit a star. Moons are smaller objects that orbit a planet. Some planets have many moons, while others have none.

CHAPTER III Alien Biology and Physiology

Alien biology and physiology are the study of the physical and chemical processes that govern the life of an alien. This includes the structure and function of their bodies, their senses, and their reproductive systems.



ALIEN'S ANATOMY Alien anatomy is the study of the physical structure of an alien. This includes the skull, spine, muscles, and internal organs.

REPRODUCTION OF ALIENS Alien reproduction is the process by which an alien produces offspring. This can be done in many different ways, including sexual and asexual reproduction.


ALIEN SENSES Alien senses are the ways in which an alien perceives its environment. This can include sight, hearing, touch, taste, and smell.

ALIEN BEHAVIOR Alien behavior is the way in which an alien acts. This can be influenced by its biology, its environment, and its culture.

CHAPTER V Technological Aliens

Many species use technology to improve their physical or mental abilities. The Cyberbrains long to extend their lifespans. To this end, they have replaced their body parts with durable mechanical components. They substituted their skulls for protective helmets made from a super-strong material called siliconium, which they believed would never break. However, a freak change in the atmosphere on their volcanic planet increased the temperature. Unfortunately, the Cyberbrains discovered that this caused some helmets to shatter – leaving many vulnerable brains exposed.


REPTON CLONES

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Repton clones are small, reptilian creatures with forked tongues, body scales, and jilla pupils.

EARTH HABITATS: Repton clones are known to inhabit volcanic regions of power in areas of large volcanic activity on Earth. They need warmth to survive, so they are most likely to be seen in the summer in large cities. They occasionally conceal themselves in swamps in subtropical zones.

MISSION: Long term, to conquer the Galaxy. Short-term, to build the next repton.

NOTES: Five Repton clones are attached to each rocket ship. A mother ship is known to have landed Repton clones. The technology of the Reptons is advanced but no longer working, since becoming clones, they've lost the capacity for original ideas.

DENEBIAN CYBORGS


Although they look like machines, Denebian Cyborgs are living organisms encased in mechanical shells that give them super-strength. They are not very intelligent and have never mastered the art of remodeling. When their ancestors destroyed the wildlife on their home planet, Denebian, through over-exploitation, they were forced to offer their services to other species in exchange for a new home on foreign planets.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: There are many different varieties of Denebian Cyborg, but they all have mechanical exo-skeletons.

EARTH HABITATS: Look for these aliens in areas where machinery abounds – on crops, factories or power plants. They digress themselves as machines to give assistance.

MISSION: To feed homes on other planets.

NOTES: They often work for the Group, but they will save any race that will leave them, including the Tardians, Traders and Proboscians.



TAU WARRIORS


Enemies of the Cyberbrains for many years, the Tau live in caves ruled over by the Red Queens. They are perfectly adapted to life in an unforgiving volcanic environment.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Tau Warriors have tough, bumpy-like exoskeletons.

CYBERBRAINS

Though the Cyberbrains' volcanic home is no longer suitable for habitation, they wage war against the Tau Warriors in the hope of ultimately conquering the Tau's planet, Volcanox, which has a similar volcanic environment.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: These tall, mechanical creatures are identifiable solely by their transparent helmets. They have good vision, being endowed with telescopic eyes.

EARTH HABITATS: Cyberbrains hang out in laboratories or research stations on Earth, looking for technology to extend their lives and help them in their war against the Tau Warriors. They try to ensure they are not seen by humans.

MISSION: Long-term, to subvert Earth Resources and ultimately cause death. Short term, to conquer Volcanox.

NOTES: They communicate by reading the color patterns on one another's bodies, as well as by sending and receiving microwaves.

NATIONAL GUARD HERO KILLED BY ALIENS?
